1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-62 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to a licensure grandfathering provision; and to amend and reenact

3 sections 43-62-01, 43-62-04, 43-62-09, 43-62-14, 43-62-15, 43-62-17, and 43-62-19 of the

4 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation and licensure of medical imaging and

5 radiation therapy practitioners.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-62-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

8 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 9 **43-62-01. Definitions.**

- "Board" means the North Dakota medical imaging and radiation therapy board of
  examiners.
- 12 2. "Certification organization" means a national certification organization that specializes-
- 13 in the certification and registration of certification of medical imaging and radiation
- 14 therapy technical personnel and which has programs accredited by the national
- 15 commission for certifying agencies, American national standards institute or the-
- international organization for standardization, or other accreditation organization recognized by the board.
- 3. "Licensed practitioner" means a licensed physician, <u>physician assistant</u>, advanced
  practice registered nurse, surgeon, <u>certified registered nurse anesthetist</u>, chiropractor,
  dentist, or podiatrist.
- 4.3. "Licensee" means an individual licensed by the board to perform medical imaging or
  radiation therapy procedures and operate medical imaging or radiation therapy
- 23 equipment, including a nuclear medicine technologist, radiation therapist,
- 24 radiographer, radiologist assistant, or sonographer.

13		densitometry, nuclear medicine technology certification board, certification board of	
14		radiology practitioner assistants, American registry for diagnostic medical sonography,	
15		cardiovascular credentialing international, or other organization that specializes in the	
16		registration of medical imaging and radiation therapy personnel recognized by the	
17		board.	
18	7.	"Radiation therapy" means the performance of any procedure or operation of radiation	
19		therapy equipment as described in this chapter and intended for use in the treatment	
20		of disease or other medical conditions in human beings.	
21	8.	"Radiation therapist" means a nonphysician licensed by the board to perform radiation	
22		therapy procedures and operate radiation therapy equipment.

5		carry into effect this chapter and incur other expenses necessary to effectuate this

8		authorized by this chapter.
9	<del>6.</del> 5.	Set fees for licensure, license renewal, and other services deemed necessary to carry
10		out the purposes of this chapter.

23		professional record and performance from recognized data sources, licensing and

26		institutions, and law enforcement agencies be reported to the board. The board or its
27		investigative panels may require an applicant for licensure or a licensee who is the
28		subject of a disciplinary investigation to submit to a statewide and nationwide criminal
29		history record check. The nationwide criminal history record check must be conducted
30		in the manner provided by section 12-60-24. All costs associated with the criminal
31		history record check are the responsibility of the licensee or applicant.

AMENDMENT. Section 43-62-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows: 22 43-62-14. License requirements. 23 The board may issue a license to any applicant who has submitted satisfactory 1. 24 evidence, verified by oath or affirmation, that the applicant: 25 At the time of the application is at least eighteen years of age. a. 26 Has successfully completed a four-year course of study in a secondary school b. 27 approved by the state board of higher education or passed an approved 28 equivalency test is currently registered with a registration organization. 29 2. In addition to the requirements of subsection 1, an individual seeking to obtain a
- 30 license for a specific modality of medical imaging or radiation therapy shall comply-
- 31 with the following requirements:

		education programs, or any other appropriate accreditation agency approved by			
		the board, provided the standards are not in conflict with board policy.

AMENDMENT. Section 43-62-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows: 8 43-62-17. Renewal. 9 1. A license issued under this chapter must be renewed before January second every 10 two years. The license must be renewed upon the payment of a renewal fee if the 11 licensee is not in violation of this chapter and has complied with any continuing-12 educationthe requirements adopted by rule of the boardthis chapter. 13 2. The board shall notify a licensee at least thirty days in advance of the expiration of the 14 licensee's license. The licensee shall inform the board of any change of the licensee's 15 address. Each licensee is responsible for renewing the licensee's license before the 16 expiration date. A license that is not renewed automatically lapses. 17 3. The board may provide for the late renewal of an automatically lapsed license upon 18 the payment of a reinstatement fee. 19 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-62-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is 20 amended and reenacted as follows: 21 43-62-19. Grounds for disciplinary action. 22 Disciplinary action may be imposed against a licensee upon any of the following grounds: 23 1. The use of any false, fraudulent, or forged statement or document, or the use of any 24 fraudulent, deceitful, dishonest, or immoral practice, in connection with any of the 25 licensing requirements. 26 2. The conviction of any misdemeanor determined by the board to have a direct bearing 27 upon an individual's ability to serve the public as a licensee or of any felony. A license 28 may not be withheld contrary to chapter 12.1-33. 29 3. Habitual use of alcohol or drugs. 30 4. Physical or mental disability materially affecting the ability to perform the duties of a 31 medical imaging or radiation therapy professional in a competent manner.

1 The performance of any dishonorable, unethical, or unprofessional conduct likely to 5. 2 deceive, defraud, or harm the public. 3 6. Aiding or abetting the performance of medical imaging or radiation therapy by an 4 unlicensed, incompetent, or impaired individual. 5 7. The violation of any provision of this chapter or any rule of the board, or any action, 6 stipulation, limitation, condition, or agreement imposed by the board or its investigative 7 panels. 8 The performance of medical imaging or radiation therapy under a false or assumed 8. 9 name. 10 9. The willful or negligent violation of the confidentiality between medical imaging or 11 radiation therapy professional and patient, except as required by law. 12 10. Gross negligence in the performance of medical imaging or radiation therapy. 13 11. Sexual abuse, misconduct, or exploitation related to the licensee's performance of 14 medical imaging or radiation therapy. 15 12. The use of any false, fraudulent, or deceptive statement in any document connected 16 with the performance of medical imaging or radiation therapy. 17 13. The failure to maintain in good standing, including completion of continuing education 18 or recertification requirements, a certification from a nationally-recognized certification-19 organization recognized by the board for the medical imaging or radiation therapy-20 modality for which a license has been issued by the board registration with a 21 registration organization. 22 14. The imposition by another state, jurisdiction, or certification organization recognized by 23 the board of disciplinary action against a license, certificationregistration, or other 24 authorization to perform medical imaging or radiation therapy based upon acts or 25 conduct by the medical imaging or radiation therapy professional which would 26 constitute grounds for disciplinary action under this section. A certified copy of the 27 record of the action taken by the other state, jurisdiction, or certificationregistration 28 organization is conclusive evidence of that action. 29 15. The failure to furnish the board or the investigative panel or investigators or 30 representatives of the board or investigative panel information legally requested by the

- 1 board or the investigative panel. The board shall keep a record of its proceedings in a
- 2 disciplinary action or refusal to issue a license, together with the evidence offered.
