- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 25-13 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the certification and sale of assistance animals; to amend and reenact
- 3 section 25-13-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions associated with
- 4 assistance animals; and to provide a penalty.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 25-13-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 **25-13-01.1. Definitions.**
- 9 For purposes of As used in this chapter "service:
- 10 <u>1.</u> "Assistance animal" means an animal, other than a service animal, that works,
- 11 performs tasks, or provides therapeutic emotional support for an individual with a
- 12 <u>disability.</u>
- 13 <u>2.</u> "Health care provider" means an individual or facility licensed, certified, or otherwise
- authorized by law to administer health care, for profit or otherwise, in the ordinary
- 15 <u>course of business or professional practice.</u>
- 16 <u>3.</u> "Health care services" means services rendered by a health care provider within the
- scope of the provider's license.
- 18 <u>4.</u> "Service animal" means anya dog trained to do work, perform tasks, or provide
- assistance for the benefit of an individual with a disability. The term includes a dog
- 20 trained to provide assistance to assist an individual with a disability, pull by pulling a
- wheelchair, lendlending balance support, retrieveretrieving dropped objects, or
- 22 <u>provide providing</u> assistance in a medical crisis.
- 23 <u>5.</u> "Therapeutic relationship" means the rendering of health care services by a health
- 24 <u>care provider in good faith and with actual knowledge of an individual's disability and</u>

2		include services provided by a person that issues a certificate, license, letter, or similar		
3	document purporting to confirm the individual has a disability or a disability-related			
4		nee	d for an assistance animal without conducting an assessment of an individual's

9	<u>1.</u>	A health care provider may not produce documentation relating to an individual's need

11		<u>a.</u>	Is actively licensed to practice medicine in the state;	
2		<u>b.</u>	Is qualified and licensed to evaluate and diagnose disabilities and has performed	
3			a disability assessment on the individual for which documentation is produced;	
4		<u>C.</u>	Has engaged with the individual in-person or remotely in at least two sessions	
5			before issuing documentation determining the individual requires an assistance	
6			animal; and	
7		<u>d.</u>	Performs a clinical evaluation of the individual no less than thirty days before	
8			producing documentation regarding the individual's need for an assistance	
9			animal.

22		<u>a.</u>	The effective date of the documentation;	
23		<u>b.</u>	The license number of the health care provider;

26			thirty days before producing the documentation regarding the individual's need

28	<u>3.</u>	A he	ealth care provider may not represent or attempt to represent that an individual has	
29		<u>a di</u>	sability requiring an assistance animal when an individual is not disabled or does	
30		not	need an assistance animal on account of the individual's disability.	

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1 An individual may not represent or attempt to represent to a third party that the 2 individual has a disability requiring an assistance animal when the individual is not 3 disabled or does not require an assistance animal on account of the individual's 4 disability. 5 Any person in violation of this section is guilty of an infraction for a first offense and a 5. 6 class B misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense. 7 This section may not be construed to restrict or modify any federal or state laws 6. 8 relating to an individual's rights for reasonable accommodation and equal access to 9 housing, including rights afforded in accordance with the Fair Housing Act [Pub. L. 10 90-284; 82 Stat. 81; 42 U.S.C. 3601, et seq.] and the Americans with Disabilities Act 11 [Pub. L. 101-336; 104 Stat. 327; 42 U.S.C 12101 et seq.]. 12 SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 25-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 13 and enacted as follows: 14 Sale of assistance animals - Notice requirements - Penalty. 15 A person selling, providing an animal for use as an assistance animal, or providing a 16 certificate or letter certifying an animal for use as an assistance animal shall provide a 17 written notice to the buyer or recipient of the animal stating the assistance animal: 18 <u>a.</u> Does not have the special training required to qualify as a service animal; and 19 Is not entitled to the rights and privileges accorded by law to a service animal. b. 20 The written notice under subsection 1 must be printed in bold in at least twelve-point <u>2.</u> 21 typeface. 22 A person violating this section is guilty of an infraction for a first offense and a class B 3. 23 misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense. 24 <u>4.</u> This section does not restrict or modify any federal or state laws relating to an 25 individual's rights for reasonable accommodation and equal access to housing,
