5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 84-1413, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:

3 84-1413 (1) Each public body shall keep minutes of all
4 meetings showing the time, place, members present and absent, and the
5 substance of all matters discussed.

6 (2) Any action taken on any question or motion duly moved 7 and seconded shall be by roll call vote of the public body in open 8 session, and the record shall state how each member voted or if the member was absent or not voting. The requirements of a roll call or 9 10 viva voce vote shall be satisfied by a municipality, a county, a learning community, a joint entity created pursuant to the Interlocal 11 12 Cooperation Act, a joint public agency created pursuant to the Joint 13 Public Agency Act, or an agency formed under the Municipal Cooperative Financing Act which utilizes an electronic voting device 14 15 which allows the yeas and nays of each member of such city council, 16 village board, county board, or governing body to be readily seen by 17 the public.

18 (3) The vote to elect leadership within a public body may
19 be taken by secret ballot, but the total number of votes for each
20 candidate shall be recorded in the minutes.

21 (4) (3) The minutes of all meetings and evidence and 22 documentation received or disclosed in open session shall be public 23 records and open to public inspection during normal business hours.

24 (5) (4) Minutes shall be written and available for 25 inspection within ten working days or prior to the next convened

meeting, whichever occurs earlier, except that cities of the second class and villages may have an additional ten working days if the employee responsible for writing the minutes is absent due to a serious illness or emergency.
