1	FOR AN ACT	relating to the Board of Educational Lands and Funds; to
2		amend sections 72-204 and 72-232, Reissue Revised
3		Statutes of Nebraska; to require that all land owned and
4		leased by the board be open to the public for hunting,
5		fur harvesting, and fishing as prescribed; to harmonize
6		provisions; to provide an operative date; and to repeal
7		the original sections.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 72-204, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 72-204 The Board of Educational Lands and Funds shall cause school land to be classified for rental purposes (1) at least 4 5 once each five years, (2) each time that the land is leased or that an assignment of a lease is made, and (3) when the board deems it to 6 7 be in the best interest of the state. The leasing of the land shall 8 be regulated by sections 72-232 to 72-239 and section 3 of this act. When a lease is offered for sale, the new rental shall be made 9 public. When the board has ordered the reclassification of any of the 10 school lands in any county, it shall prescribe the method and 11 12 promulgate rules governing the classification of educational lands. 13 It shall have a classification of all the educational lands in the county prepared by a competent person, who shall make a detailed 14 15 field examination of each forty-acre tract of educational lands for 16 the purpose of obtaining information as to the type and rating of the soil, its adaptability, the topographical character of the land, and 17 the location and number of acres of each type. His or her report of 18 such field examination shall be prepared in the form of a detailed 19 20 map with complete explanations and shall be filed with the board. The 21 board may employ private appraisal firms to aid it in determining the value of educational lands. 22

Sec. 2. Section 72-232, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

72-232 (1) The Board of Educational Lands and Funds shall

have authority to adopt such rules and regulations as it shall deem necessary in the leasing of school lands and to prescribe such terms and conditions of the lease, not inconsistent with sections 72-205, 72-232 to 72-235, 72-240.02 to 72-240.05, and 72-242 and section 3 of this act, as it shall deem necessary to protect the interests of the state.

7 (2) The board shall adopt and enforce a soil conservation 8 program. Failure of the lessee to utilize the land for the purpose 9 for which the land was leased or to observe and carry out soil 10 conservation requirements as provided in the rules and regulations of 11 the board shall be cause for cancellation of the lease.

12 (3) No individual, partnership, limited liability 13 company, or corporation shall be entitled to hold under lease a total 14 of more than six hundred forty acres of state educational lands, 15 whether acquired by direct lease or by assignment. Such limitation 16 shall not apply when the land to be leased is bounded entirely on one 17 side thereof by lands owned or operated by such applicant or 18 assignee.

19 Sec. 3. (1) Beginning October 1, 2012, and subject to the 20 Game Law, the Board of Educational Lands and Funds shall require that 21 all land owned by the board be open to the public for hunting, fur 22 harvesting, and fishing.

(2) Beginning October 1, 2012, and subject to the Game
 Law, as old leases expire and new leases are entered into, the board
 shall require that all land owned and leased by the board be open to

1	the public for hunting, fur harvesting, and fishing. The requirement
2	that such land be open to the public for hunting, fur harvesting, and
3	fishing shall be included as a part of the lease.
4	(3) The board may adopt and promulgate rules and
5	regulations to administer this section with respect to public safety
6	and land use.
7	Sec. 4. This act becomes operative on October 1, 2012.

9	Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
