A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to special education; to adopt the Blind Persons
- 2 Literacy Rights and Education Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 3 of this act shall be known and

- 2 may be cited as the Blind Persons Literacy Rights and Education Act.
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Blind Persons Literacy Rights
- 4 and Education Act:
- 5 (1) Blind and visually impaired has the definition found
- 6 in section 79-1118.01; and
- 7 (2) Braille means a system of reading and writing through
- 8 touch commonly known as Standard English Braille.
- 9 Sec. 3. A teacher employed by or under contract with a
- 10 school district, educational service unit, other education agency, or
- 11 the State Department of Education who teaches blind or visually
- 12 impaired children shall demonstrate competence in reading and writing
- braille. Such competence may be demonstrated by:
- 14 (1) Possession by the teacher of an active National
- 15 <u>Certification in Literary Braille from the National Blindness</u>
- 16 Professional Certification Board by the 2012-13 school year, and such
- 17 certification shall be paid for by the individual; or
- 18 (2) Passing an examination developed and administered by
- 19 the State Department of Education which includes, but need not be
- 20 limited to, braille writing using a braille writer, braille writing
- 21 using a slate and stylus, proofreading, identifying braille errors,
- 22 correct usage and rules, and other matters determined by the
- 23 <u>department to demonstrate competence to provide instruction in</u>
- 24 <u>braille</u>. Such examination shall be no less stringent than the
- 25 examination to obtain a National Certification in Literary Braille
