- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to mental health; to create the Mental Health
- 2 Crisis Hotline Task Force; to provide powers and duties; and to
- 3 declare an emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) The Mental Health Crisis Hotline Task Force is
- 2 <u>created. The task force shall develop an implementation plan for Nebraska</u>
- 3 to integrate and utilize the 988 mental health crisis hotline established
- 4 pursuant to the federal National Suicide Hotline Designation Act of 2020,
- 5 Public Law 116-172.
- 6 (2) The task force shall identify a method to integrate local mental
- 7 health crisis hotlines to ensure each individual who accesses a local
- 8 mental health crisis hotline is connected to a qualified mental or
- 9 behavioral health professional regardless of the time, date, or number of
- 10 individuals trying to simultaneously access a local mental health crisis
- 11 hotline. The task force shall develop a plan for staffing a statewide
- 12 <u>mental health crisis hotline, shall coordinate with local mental health</u>
- 13 <u>authorities to carry out this section, and may conduct any other business</u>
- 14 related to such duties.
- 15 (3) The federal National Suicide Hotline Designation Act of 2020
- 16 <u>authorizes states to impose fees on telecommunications services, wireless</u>
- 17 device services, and Internet protocol-enabled voice services to provide
- 18 funding in a manner similar to the funding of 911 services. The task
- 19 force shall conduct a cost analysis to determine how such a fee structure
- 20 <u>could be designed to cover the costs of the 988 mental health crisis</u>
- 21 hotline.
- 22 (4) The task force shall consist of the following members:
- 23 (a) The chairperson of the Health and Human Services Committee of
- 24 <u>the Legislature or the chairperson's designee;</u>
- 25 (b) The chairperson of the Judiciary Committee of the Legislature or
- 26 the chairperson's designee;
- 27 (c) The chairperson of the Transportation and Telecommunications
- 28 Committee of the Legislature or the chairperson's designee;
- 29 <u>(d) Two at-large members of the Legislature appointed by the</u>
- 30 Executive Board of the Legislative Council;
- 31 (e) The Director of Behavioral Health of the Division of Behavioral

1 Health of the Department of Health and Human Services or the director's

- 2 <u>designee</u>, as a nonvoting, ex officio member;
- 3 <u>(f) The chairperson of the Public Service Commission or the</u>
- 4 chairperson's designee, as a nonvoting, ex officio member; and
- 5 (g) The following members who shall be nonvoting members appointed
- 6 by the voting members of the task force listed in subdivisions (a)
- 7 <u>through (d) of this subsection through an application and selection</u>
- 8 process and selected from among (i) mental or behavioral health
- 9 clinicians licensed to practice in the state, (ii) behavioral and mental
- 10 health service providers, (iii) advocacy groups that focus on behavioral
- 11 and mental health, (iv) educational institutions, (v) county and
- 12 <u>municipal law enforcement from each congressional district, (vi) other</u>
- 13 representatives of county and municipal governments from each
- 14 congressional district, and (vii) telecommunications industry
- 15 representatives.
- 16 (5) The task force shall choose a chairperson and a vice-chairperson
- 17 from its voting membership. The task force shall meet at the call of the
- 18 chairperson but shall hold its first meeting no later than July 1, 2021.
- 19 The members of the task force shall serve without compensation but shall
- 20 be entitled to receive reimbursement for expenses incurred incident to
- 21 such service as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177. The Executive
- 22 Board of the Legislative Council may provide the task force with a legal
- 23 counsel, committee clerk, and other staff as required by the task force
- 24 <u>from existing legislative staff.</u>
- 25 (6) The task force shall file a report electronically with the Clerk
- 26 of the Legislature, and with the Governor, regarding its implementation
- 27 plan and any recommendations, together with drafts of any legislation
- 28 <u>necessary to carry out any recommendations, no later than December 17,</u>
- 29 2021.
- 30 (7) The task force shall terminate on December 31, 2022.
- 31 Sec. 2. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when

1 passed and approved according to law.
