1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Health Care Certificate of Need
2	Act; to amend section 71-5829.04, Reissue Revised
3	Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions relating to
4	the moratorium on long-term care beds; to repeal the
5	original section; and to declare an emergency.
6	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 71-5829.04, Reissue Revised Statutes

- of Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 71-5829.04 (1) All long-term care beds which require a
- 4 certificate of need under section 71-5829.03 are subject to a
- 5 moratorium unless one of the following exceptions applies:
- 6 (a) An exception to the moratorium may be granted if the
- 7 department establishes that the needs of individuals whose medical
- 8 and nursing needs are complex or intensive and are above the level of
- 9 capabilities of staff and above the services ordinarily provided in a
- 10 long-term care bed are not currently being met by the long-term care
- 11 beds licensed in the health planning region; or
- 12 (b) If the average occupancy for all licensed long-term
- 13 care beds located in a twenty-five mile twenty-five-mile radius of
- 14 the proposed site have-has exceeded ninety percent occupancy during
- 15 the most recent three consecutive calendar quarters as reported at
- 16 the time of the application filing and there is a long-term care bed
- 17 need as determined under this section, the department may grant an
- 18 exception to the moratorium and issue a certificate of need. If the
- 19 department determines average occupancy for all licensed long-term
- 20 care beds located in a twenty-five mile twenty-five-mile radius of
- 21 the proposed site has not exceeded ninety percent occupancy during
- 22 the most recent three consecutive calendar quarters as reported at
- 23 the time of the application filing, the department shall deny the
- 24 application unless the department determines that all long-term care
- 25 beds in a licensed facility located in a city of the second class or

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village have been sold or transferred to another facility or 1 2 facilities located outside of the twenty-five-mile radius of the city 3 or village resulting in no licensed long-term care beds within the 4 corporate limits of the city of the second class or village. In such 5 case, the department shall waive the certificate of need limitations of this subdivision for development and licensure of a long-term care 6 7 facility by a political subdivision or a nonprofit organization in 8 such a city of the second class or village if the political 9 subdivision or nonprofit organization agrees not to sell long-term 10 care beds licensed under such waiver or increase the number of longterm care beds as allowed under subdivision (3) of section 71-5829.03 11 12 until five years have passed after such beds are first occupied. The 13 number of licensed long-term care beds in the facility shall be limited to the number of long-term care beds sold or transferred as 14 described in this subdivision. 15 16 (2) The department shall review applications which require a certificate of need under section 71-5829.03 and determine 17 if there is a need for additional long-term care beds as provided in 18 19 this section. No such application shall be approved if the current 20 supply of licensed long-term care beds in the health planning region 21 of the proposed site exceeds the long-term care bed need for that health planning region. For purposes of this section: 22 23 (a) Long-term care bed need is equal to the population of the health planning region, multiplied by the utilization rate of 24 25 long-term care beds within the health planning region, and the result

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1 divided by the minimum occupancy rate of long-term care beds within

- 2 the health planning region;
- 3 (b) Population is the most recent projection of
- 4 population for the health planning region for the year which is
- 5 closest to the fifth year immediately following the date of the
- 6 application. The applicant shall provide such projection as part of
- 7 the application using data from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln
- 8 Bureau of Business Research or other source approved by the
- 9 department;
- 10 (c) The utilization rate is the number of people using
- 11 long-term care beds living in the health planning region in which the
- 12 proposed project is located divided by the population of the health
- 13 planning region; and
- 14 (d) The minimum occupancy rate is ninety-five percent for
- 15 health planning regions which are part of or contain a Metropolitan
- 16 Statistical Area as defined by the United States Bureau of the
- 17 Census. For all other health planning regions in the state, the
- 18 minimum occupancy rate is ninety percent.
- 19 (3) To facilitate the review and determination required
- 20 by this section, each health care facility with long-term care beds
- 21 shall report on a quarterly basis to the department the number of
- 22 residents at such facility on the last day of the immediately
- 23 preceding quarter on a form provided by the department. Such report
- 24 shall be provided to the department no later than ninety days after
- 25 the last day of the immediately preceding quarter. The department

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- 1 shall provide the occupancy data collected from such reports upon
- 2 request. Any facility failing to timely report such information shall
- 3 be ineligible for any exception to the requirement for a certificate
- 4 of need under section 71-5830.01 and any exception to the moratorium
- 5 imposed under this section and may not receive, transfer, or relocate
- 6 long-term care beds.
- 7 Sec. 2. Original section 71-5829.04, Reissue Revised
- 8 Statutes of Nebraska, is repealed.
- 9 Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 10 when passed and approved according to law.
