- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to natural resources; to state legislative
- findings; to create the Statewide Tourism And Recreational Water
- 3 Access and Resource Sustainability Special Committee of the
- 4 Legislature; to provide powers and duties; to provide a termination
- 5 date for the committee; and to declare an emergency.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

LB406 2021

- 1 Section 1. The Legislature finds and declares as follows:
- 2 (1) The future vibrancy of the people, communities, and businesses
- 3 <u>of Nebraska depends on reliable sources of water;</u>
- 4 (2) While it is in the state's best interest to retain control over
- 5 <u>its water supplies, much of the state's water resources are currently</u>
- 6 underutilized;
- 7 (3) Well-planned flood control is critical to the future of the
- 8 people, communities, and businesses of Nebraska;
- 9 (4) The state's water resources provide economic benefit to the
- 10 people, communities, and businesses of Nebraska by helping to attract
- 11 <u>visitors from other states and boost local economies;</u>
- 12 <u>(5) Nebraska has tremendous water resources across the state,</u>
- 13 including, but not limited to, the Ogallala Aquifer, Lake McConaughy, the
- 14 Platte River, the Republican River, and the Missouri River. The state's
- 15 <u>lakes and rivers help Nebraskans enjoy the water resources in our state</u>
- 16 and make Nebraska an even more attractive place to live and raise a
- 17 family;
- 18 (6) In light of the disruption from the COVID-19 coronavirus
- 19 pandemic and the trend toward a remote workforce around the country,
- 20 people around the country are rethinking where they want to work, live,
- 21 and raise a family. As people consider where to live, access to
- 22 sustainable water resources and outdoor recreational opportunities will
- 23 be important considerations in making Nebraska a competitive choice for
- 24 the future;
- 25 (7) Studies should be conducted focusing on securing Nebraska's
- 26 future water supply and strengthening Nebraska's flood control
- 27 <u>infrastructure</u>, <u>while also considering economic and recreational</u>
- 28 opportunities, including opportunities from increased tourism, in finding
- 29 innovative solutions and winning opportunities for the State of Nebraska;
- 30 (8) Any such studies must not deter ongoing economic activity or
- 31 fail to protect current investment in the areas under study; and

- 1 (9) An investment in a one-time series of studies that take
- 2 advantage of previous studies while including innovative approaches and
- 3 <u>new technologies is best positioned to find solutions for all Nebraskans,</u>
- 4 <u>especially Nebraskans living, working, and investing in the areas under</u>
- 5 <u>study</u>.
- 6 Sec. 2. (1) The Statewide Tourism And Recreational Water Access and
- 7 Resource Sustainability (STAR WARS) Special Committee of the Legislature
- 8 is hereby established as a special legislative committee to exercise the
- 9 powers and perform the duties provided in this section. The special
- 10 legislative committee shall consist of no fewer than seven members of the
- 11 Legislature as determined by the Executive Board of the Legislative
- 12 Council. The special legislative committee shall consist of the Speaker
- 13 of the Legislature, who shall serve as chairperson of the special
- 14 legislative committee, the chairperson of the Natural Resources Committee
- 15 of the Legislature, one member of the Appropriations Committee of the
- 16 Legislature, and at least four other members of the Legislature appointed
- 17 by the executive board. The appointed members of the special legislative
- 18 committee shall be members who represent legislative districts comprising
- 19 portions of the areas under study or who otherwise have knowledge of such
- 20 areas.
- 21 (2) The Executive Board of the Legislative Council shall provide
- 22 staff as required by the special legislative committee from existing
- 23 legislative staff. In addition, the special legislative committee may
- 24 <u>hire additional staff, make expenditures for travel, and enter into</u>
- 25 contracts for consulting, engineering, and development studies. The
- 26 <u>contracts shall be based on competitive bids and subject to approval by</u>
- 27 the executive board upon the recommendation of a majority of the members
- 28 of the special legislative committee. It is the intent of the Legislature
- 29 <u>to appropriate two million dollars for fiscal year 2021-22 to carry out</u>
- 30 the purposes of this section.
- 31 (3)(a) Studies shall be conducted on:

- 1 (i) The need to protect public and private property, including use
- 2 of levee systems, enhance economic development, and promote private
- 3 investment and the creation of jobs along the Platte River and its
- 4 tributaries from Columbus, Nebraska, to Plattsmouth, Nebraska;
- 5 (ii) The need to provide for public safety, public infrastructure,
- 6 land-use planning, recreation, and economic development in the Lake
- 7 McConaughy region of Keith County, Nebraska; and
- 8 (iii) The socioeconomic conditions, recreational and tourism
- 9 opportunities, and public investment necessary to enhance economic
- 10 development and to catalyze private investment in the region in Knox
- 11 County, Nebraska, that lies north of State Highway 12 and extends to the
- 12 <u>South Dakota border and includes Lewis and Clark Lake and Niobrara State</u>
- 13 <u>Park.</u>
- 14 (b) The study of the Lower Platte River pursuant to subdivision (3)
- 15 (a)(i) of this section shall not include a study of any dam on a Platte
- 16 River channel, but may include infrastructure options that maintain the
- 17 integrity of the main channel of the Platte River. The committee may
- 18 study dams relating to tributaries of the Platte River and levees in such
- 19 area.
- 20 <u>(c) The studies regarding Lake McConaughy in Keith County and Lewis</u>
- 21 and Clark Lake and Niobrara State Park in Knox County shall evaluate the
- 22 outcomes and the economic benefits of proposed development and
- 23 improvements to residents, the local region, and state tourism.
- 24 (4) The special legislative committee may hold hearings and request
- 25 and receive reports from federal, state, county, city, and village
- 26 agencies and natural resources districts regarding matters pertaining to
- 27 such studies. The special legislative committee may hold one or more
- 28 closed sessions for the receipt of confidential information if at least
- one-half of the members of the special legislative committee vote in open
- 30 session to hold a closed session. The special legislative committee may
- 31 appoint one or more subcommittees for the purpose of receiving public

- 2 <u>and this section.</u>
- 3 <u>(5) The special legislative committee shall endeavor to complete</u>
- 4 <u>each study on or before December 31, 2021, but such studies shall be</u>
- 5 completed no later than December 31, 2022.
- 6 (6) The special legislative committee shall terminate on December
- 7 31, 2022.
- 8 Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 9 passed and approved according to law.
