5		issuance of certificates; to require employment of
6		certified personnel; to require the presence of
7		authorized personnel; to provide for a fee; to harmonize
8		provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 53-101, Revised Statutes Cumulative 2 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read: 3 53-101 Sections 53-101 to 53-1,122 and sections 4 and 5 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Liquor 4 5 Control Act. Sec. 2. Section 53-117.03, Reissue Revised Statutes of 6 7 Nebraska, is amended to read: 8 53-117.03 (1) On or before January 1, 2007, the The 9 commission shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations governing 10 programs which provide training for persons employed in the sale and 11 service of alcoholic liquor and management of licensed premises. Such 12 rules and regulations may include, but need not be limited to: 13 (a) Minimum standards governing training of beverage 14 servers, including standards and requirements governing curriculum, 15 program trainers, and certification requirements; 16 (b) Minimum standards governing training in management of licensed premises, including standards and requirements governing 17 18 curriculum, program trainers, and certification requirements; 19 (c) Minimum standards governing the methods allowed for 20 training programs which may include the Internet, interactive video, 21 live training in various locations across the state, and other means deemed appropriate by the commission; 22 23 for approving beverage-server (d) Methods training organizations and programs. All beverage-server training programs 24 25 approved by the commission shall issue a certificate of completion to

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2 the names of all persons completing the program to the commission; 3 (e) Enrollment fees in an amount determined by the 4 commission to be necessary to cover the expense of enrolling in a 5 training program offered by the commission pursuant to subsection (2)

all persons who successfully complete the program and shall provide

6 of this section, but not to exceed thirty dollars; and

7 (f) Procedures and fees for certification, which fees 8 shall be in an amount determined by the commission to be sufficient 9 to defray the expenses associated with maintaining a list of persons 10 certified under this section and issuing proof of certification to 11 eligible individuals but shall not exceed twenty dollars.

12 (2) The commission may create a program to provide 13 training for persons employed in the sale and service of alcoholic liquor and management of licensed premises. The program shall include 14 15 training on the issues of sales and service of alcoholic liquor to minors and to visibly inebriated purchasers. The commission may 16 charge each person enrolling in the program an enrollment fee as 17 provided in the rules and regulations, but such fee shall not exceed 18 thirty dollars. All such fees shall be collected by the commission 19 20 and remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission Rule and Regulation Cash Fund. 21

(3) A person who has completed a training program which complies with the rules and regulations, whether such program is offered by the commission or by another organization, may become certified by the commission upon the commission receiving evidence

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1 that he or she has completed such program and the person seeking 2 certification paying the certification fee established under this 3 section.

4 (4) In order to receive certification from the 5 commission, a person shall file an application on a form prescribed by the commission and pay a certification application fee of fifteen 6 7 dollars. The applicant shall include evidence of successful completion of a course as provided for in this section and successful 8 9 completion of the examination prescribed by the commission. Upon 10 successful completion of the application process, the commission shall provide the applicant with a certified seller document which 11 12 shall be valid for three years.

Sec. 3. Section 53-117.06, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

53-117.06 Any money collected by the commission pursuant 15 to section <u>53-117.03</u>, <u>53-117.05</u>, or <u>53-167.02</u> shall be credited to 16 the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission Rule and Regulation Cash Fund, 17 which fund is hereby created. The purpose of the fund shall be to 18 cover any costs incurred by the commission in producing or 19 20 distributing the material referred to in such-sections 53-117.05 and 53-167.02 and to defray the costs associated with electronic 21 regulatory transactions, industry education events, enforcement 22 training, and equipment for regulatory work, and administering 23 section 53-117.03 and section 4 of this act. Transfers may be made 24 from the fund to the General Fund at the direction of the 25

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Legislature. Any money in the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission Rule
 and Regulation Cash Fund available for investment shall be invested
 by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital
 Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.

5 Sec. 4. (1) Beginning November 1, 2014, a retail licensee б shall only employ a person to be engaged in the sale or service of 7 alcohol, in management, or in security for licensed premises or to be 8 in any other way responsible for verifying a customer's age if such 9 person has successfully completed a course and received a 10 certification as provided for in section 53-117.03. The person shall show proof of certification to the retail licensee by presenting the 11 12 certification issued by the commission. The retail licensee shall 13 maintain on its licensed premises a copy of each employee's required 14 <u>certificate.</u>

15 (2) Any retail licensee who employs a person in violation
16 of this section may have its license suspended, canceled, or revoked
17 by the commission.

Sec. 5. <u>At all times when alcoholic liquor is being</u> <u>lawfully sold or dispensed for consumption on any premises licensed</u> <u>under the Nebraska Liquor Control Act, the licensee shall provide for</u> <u>an employee or other authorized representative of the licensee who is</u> <u>twenty-one years of age or older to be on duty on the premises of the</u> <u>licensee.</u>
