# A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to insurance; to adopt the Health Insurance
- 2 Exchange Navigator Registration Act; to provide
- 3 severability; and to declare an emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 8 of this act shall be known and

- 2 may be cited as the Health Insurance Exchange Navigator Registration
- 3 Act.
- 4 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Health Insurance Exchange
- 5 Navigator Registration Act:
- 6 (1) Director means the Director of Insurance;
- 7 (2) Exchange means any health insurance exchange
- 8 established or operating in this state, including any exchange
- 9 established or operated by the United States Department of Health and
- 10 Human Services; and
- 11 (3) Navigator means any individual or entity, other than
- 12 an insurance producer or consultant, that receives any funding,
- 13 directly or indirectly, from an exchange, the state, or the federal
- 14 government to perform the duties identified in 42 U.S.C. 18031(i)(3),
- as such section existed on January 1, 2013.
- 16 Sec. 3. (1) No individual or entity shall perform, offer
- 17 to perform, or advertise any service as a navigator in this state
- 18 <u>unless registered as a navigator by the director.</u>
- 19 (2) A navigator shall not:
- 20 (a) Engage in any activities that would require an
- 21 <u>insurance producer license;</u>
- (b) Violate section 44-4050;
- (c) Recommend or endorse a particular health plan;
- 24 (d) Accept any compensation or consideration from an
- 25 insurance company, broker, or consultant that is dependent, in whole

1 or in part, on whether a person enrolls in or purchases a qualified

- 2 health plan; or
- 3 (e) Fail to respond to any written inquiry from the
- 4 director regarding the navigator's duties as a navigator or fail to
- 5 request additional reasonable time to respond within fifteen working
- 6 days.
- 7 Sec. 4. (1) An individual applying for an individual
- 8 navigator registration shall make application to the director on a
- 9 form developed by the director which, unless preempted by federal
- 10 law, is accompanied by the initial individual registration fee in an
- 11 amount not to exceed twenty-five dollars as established by the
- 12 <u>director</u>. The individual shall declare in the application under
- 13 penalty of refusal, suspension, or revocation of the registration
- 14 that the statements made in the application are true, correct, and
- 15 complete to the best of the individual's knowledge and belief. Before
- 16 approving the application, the director shall find that the
- 17 individual:
- 18 (a) Is at least eighteen years of age;
- 19 (b) Has successfully passed an examination prescribed by
- 20 an exchange established or operating in this state and has been
- 21 <u>authorized to act as a navigator; and</u>
- 22 (c) Has identified any entity navigator with which he or
- 23 she is affiliated and supervised.
- 24 (2) An entity applying for an entity navigator
- 25 registration shall make application on a form developed by the

1 director and which contains the information prescribed by the

- 2 director and which, unless preempted by federal law, is accompanied
- 3 by the initial entity registration fee in an amount not to exceed
- 4 fifty dollars as established by the director.
- 5 (3) The director may require any documents deemed
- 6 necessary to verify the information contained in an application
- 7 <u>submitted in accordance with subsections (1) and (2) of this section.</u>
- 8 (4) A registered navigator shall, in a manner prescribed
- 9 by the director, notify the director within thirty days of any
- 10 <u>federal action that restricts or terminates the navigator's</u>
- 11 authorization to act as a navigator.
- 12 <u>(5) A registered entity navigator shall, in a manner</u>
- 13 prescribed by the director, provide the director with a list of all
- 14 <u>individual navigators that it employs, supervises, or is affiliated</u>
- 15 <u>with.</u>
- 16 Sec. 5. (1) Individual and entity registrations shall
- 17 expire one year after the date of issuance.
- 18 (2) An individual navigator may file an application for
- 19 renewal of a registration on a form developed by the director and,
- 20 unless preempted by federal law, shall pay the renewal fee in an
- 21 amount not to exceed twenty-five dollars as established by the
- 22 director, and an entity navigator may file an application for renewal
- 23 of a registration on a form developed by the director and, unless
- 24 preempted by federal law, shall pay the renewal fee in an amount not
- 25 to exceed fifty dollars as established by the director. An individual

1 navigator who fails to file prior to the expiration of the current

- 2 registration for registration renewal, unless preempted by federal
- 3 law, shall pay a late fee in an amount not to exceed fifty dollars as
- 4 established by the director, and an entity navigator that fails to
- 5 file prior to the expiration of the current registration for
- 6 registration renewal, unless preempted by federal law, shall pay a
- 7 <u>late fee in an amount not to exceed fifty dollars as established by</u>
- 8 the director.
- 9 (3) Any failure to fulfill the federal ongoing training
- 10 and continuing education requirements shall result in the expiration
- 11 of the registration.
- 12 Sec. 6. On contact with an individual who acknowledges
- 13 having existing health insurance coverage obtained through a licensed
- 14 insurance producer, a navigator shall make a reasonable effort to
- 15 inform the individual that he or she may, but is not required to,
- 16 seek further assistance from that producer or another licensed
- 17 producer for information, assistance, and any other services and that
- 18 tax credits may not be available to offset the premium cost of plans
- 19 that are marketed outside of the exchange.
- 20 Sec. 7. (1) The director, after notice and hearing, may
- 21 place on probation, suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue, renew, or
- 22 reinstate a navigator registration for violation of the Health
- 23 Insurance Exchange Navigator Registration Act.
- 24 (2) Except as otherwise provided by law, the director may
- 25 examine and investigate the business affairs and records of any

1 navigator as such business affairs and records regard the navigator's

- 2 duties as a navigator to determine whether the navigator has engaged
- 3 or is engaging in any violation of the act.
- 4 (3) An entity navigator registration may be suspended or
- 5 revoked or renewal or reinstatement thereof may be refused if the
- 6 director finds, after notice and hearing, that an individual
- 7 navigator's violation was known by the employing or supervising
- 8 entity navigator and the violation was not reported to the director
- 9 and no corrective action was undertaken.
- 10 Sec. 8. The director may adopt and promulgate rules and
- 11 regulations to carry out the Health Insurance Exchange Navigator
- 12 <u>Registration Act.</u>
- Sec. 9. If any section in this act or any part of any
- 14 section is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the declaration
- 15 shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining
- 16 portions.
- 17 Sec. 10. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 18 when passed and approved according to law.
