Section 1. Section 28-101, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2024, is amended to read:
- 3 28-101 Sections 28-101 to 28-1357, 28-1601 to 28-1603, and 28-1701
- 4 and section 2 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska
- 5 Criminal Code.
- 6 **Sec. 2.** (1) For purposes of this section:
- 7 (a) Athletic contest means any interscholastic, intercollegiate, or
- 8 any other organized amateur or professional athletic contest; and
- 9 <u>(b) Sports official means any individual who:</u>
- (i) Serves as a referee, umpire, or linesman or who serves in a
- 11 <u>similar capacity but is known by a different title or name; and</u>
- 12 <u>(ii) Is duly registered by, or a member of, a local, state,</u>
- 13 regional, or national organization engaged in part in providing education
- 14 and training to sports officials.
- 15 (2) A person commits the offense of assault on a sports official if
- 16 <u>such person:</u>
- 17 <u>(a) Intentionally or knowingly causes bodily injury to a sports</u>
- 18 official;
- 19 <u>(b) Such offense is committed immediately prior to, during, or</u>
- 20 <u>immediately following an athletic contest in which the sports official is</u>
- 21 participating; and
- 22 (c) The person who commits the offense knows or reasonably should
- 23 know that the victim is a sports official.
- 24 (3) A violation of this section is a Class IV felony.
