- 2 79-713, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 79-760.01,
- 3 Revised Statutes Supplement, 2021; to change provisions relating to
- 4 comprehensive health education; to prohibit academic content
- 5 standards in new areas; and to repeal the original sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 79-712, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 79-712 Provisions shall be made by the proper local school
- 4 authorities for instructing the pupils in all public schools in a
- 5 comprehensive health education program which shall consist of include
- 6 instruction (1) as to the physiological, psychological, and sociological
- 7 aspects of drug use, misuse, and abuse and (2) on intellectual disability
- 8 and other developmental disabilities, such as cerebral palsy, autism, and
- 9 epilepsy, their causes, and the prevention thereof through proper
- 10 nutrition and the avoidance of the consumption of drugs as defined in
- 11 this section. For purposes of this section, drugs means any and all
- 12 biologically active substances used in the treatment of illnesses or for
- 13 recreation or pleasure. Special emphasis shall be placed upon the
- 14 commonly abused drugs of tobacco, alcohol, marijuana, hallucinogenics,
- amphetamines, barbiturates, and narcotics.
- Sec. 2. Section 79-713, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 18 79-713 The Commissioner of Education shall prepare such teaching
- 19 aids and materials as may be necessary for an effective <u>instruction</u>
- 20 course in comprehensive health as provided in section 79-712 education,
- 21 which shall include drug education, for distribution to all public and
- 22 private schools requesting such materials and approved for continued
- 23 legal operation under rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by
- 24 the State Board of Education pursuant to subdivision (5)(c) of section
- 25 79-318.
- Sec. 3. Section 79-760.01, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2021, is
- 27 amended to read:
- 28 79-760.01 (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt measurable
- 29 academic content standards for at least the grade levels required for
- 30 statewide assessment pursuant to section 79-760.03. The standards shall
- 31 cover the subject areas of reading, writing, mathematics, science, and

- 1 social studies.
- 2 (2) The board shall also adopt measurable academic content standards
- 3 for financial literacy as part of the social studies standards.
- 4 (3) Academic content standards adopted or recommended pursuant to
- 5 this section shall be sufficiently clear and measurable to be used for
- 6 testing student performance with respect to mastery of the content
- 7 described in the state standards.
- 8 (4) The State Board of Education shall develop a plan to review and
- 9 update standards for each subject area every seven years. The state board
- 10 plan shall include a review of commonly accepted standards adopted by
- 11 school districts.
- 12 (5) The State Board of Education shall not develop, approve,
- 13 <u>distribute, adopt, or promulgate any academic content standards in a new</u>
- 14 content area that is not explicitly authorized in subsection (1) or (2)
- 15 of this section.
