#### **SYNOPSIS**

Extends annual horse racing purse subsidies through State fiscal year 2029.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As reported by the Assembly Regulated Professions Committee with technical review.



1 **AN ACT** concerning horse racing purse subsidies and amending P.L.2019, c.36.

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 1 of P.L.2019, c.36 (C.5:5-99.1) is amended to read as follows:
- 9 1. There shall be appropriated out of the General Fund of the State in the current fiscal year 2019 and in each of the [four] ten 10 11 fiscal years thereafter \$20,000,000 annually to the New Jersey 12 Racing Commission to be used for horse racing purse subsidies. These amounts shall be allocated by the New Jersey Racing 13 14 Commission equally between the thoroughbred industry and the 15 standardbred industry. Of the funds allocated to the thoroughbred 16 industry, 100 percent shall be allocated to Monmouth Park 17 overnight purses. Of the funds allocated to the standardbred 18 industry, 60 percent shall be allocated to Meadowlands overnight 19 purses; 16 percent to Freehold overnight purses; 12 percent to the New Jersey Sire Stakes purses; 6 percent to purse bonuses for New 20 21 Jersey sired horses; and 6 percent for breeders awards purses.

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- 2. Section 4 of P.L.2019, c.36 (C.5:5-99.2) is amended to read as follows:
- 26 4. The recipient of any funds appropriated or allocated pursuant to [this act,] P.L.2019, c.36 (C.5:5-99.1 et al.) , as 27 amended, as a condition of receiving any such funds in the 28 29 subsequent fiscal year thereafter, shall file an annual report with the 30 Governor, the Legislature, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 31 (C.52:14-19.1), and the New Jersey Racing Commission that 32 documents the purposes for which those funds were used and the 33 amounts allocated for those purposes. Each annual report shall 34 include, but not be limited to, the following information: impact on 35 the handle/total amount bet; impact on the total number of horses in 36 the races; impact on the number of New Jersey bred horses in the 37 races; impact on the number of New Jersey bred horses winning 38 races; number of brood mares in New Jersey; number of New Jersey 39 bred foals born; and any impact on the New Jersey Sire Stakes 40 program. Each annual report shall also include a comparison for 41 each fiscal year during which funds are received with each of the 42 five years immediately preceding the first year in which funds are 43 received of the number of races held each year, the number of 44 horses in each race, the number of bets placed on horse races, the 45 number of horses aged four years or younger stabled for a majority
