## **SUMMARY**

**Synopsis:** Establishes and allocates funds for program to provide mental health

services to veterans; appropriates \$2 million.

**Type of Impact:** Annual State expenditure increase.

**Agencies Affected:** Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs.

- The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) determines that the bill may result in a State cost increase of up to \$2 million in the first year the bill is in effect for a new grant program to provide mental health services to veterans. If the full \$2 million is not expended in the first year, the residual amount will be spent in subsequent fiscal years until the full \$2 million is exhausted.
- Future year costs to the State are indeterminate and will depend on the number and dollar amount of grants awarded to recognized veterans' organizations to provide mental health services to veterans.

### **BILL DESCRIPTION**

This bill requires the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs to establish a program to provide grants to recognized veterans organizations to provide mental health services to veterans. The bill defines recognized veterans organizations as a veteran organization that qualifies as a section 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(19) tax-exempt organization under the federal Internal Revenue Code, a federally chartered Veterans' Service Organization, the New Jersey Veterans Stakeholders Group, or the New Jersey Catholic Charities Diocese.

The bill appropriates \$2 million from the State General Fund for the purpose of providing the grants.



# **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

### OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The OLS determines that the bill may result in a State cost increase of up to \$2 million in the first year the bill is in effect for a new grant program to provide mental health services to veterans. If the full \$2 million is not expended in the first year, the residual amount will be spent in subsequent fiscal years until the full \$2 million is exhausted.

Future year costs to the State are indeterminate and will depend on the number and dollar amount of grants awarded to recognized veterans' organizations to provide mental health services to veterans.

The bill would cause an increase in the administrative workload of the department that may be absorbed by the department's operating budget.
