# LEGISLATIVE FISCAL ESTIMATE SENATE, No. 2908 STATE OF NEW JERSEY 221st LEGISLATURE

# **SUMMARY**

**Synopsis:** Requires MVC to issue special windshield stickers marking electric

vehicles exempt from emission inspections.

**Type of Impact:** Annual Increase in State expenditures

**Agencies Affected:** New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission

- The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) estimates that the bill will increase annual State
  expenditures for the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission associated with the design,
  production, and issuance of special windshield stickers marking electric vehicles exempt from
  emission inspections.
- The OLS estimates that the cost of the stickers will be the highest in year one when presumably
  all existing electric vehicles will also receive a sticker. Thereafter, the commission will only
  issue windshield stickers to newly registered electric vehicles.

# **BILL DESCRIPTION**

This bill requires the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission to issue special windshield stickers free-of-charge for electric vehicles that are registered in New Jersey to indicate that the vehicles are exempt from emission inspections beginning a year after the bill's date of enactment. The bill defines "electric vehicle" to mean any vehicle powered solely by an electric motor without an on-board engine or generator, and that does not use a hydrocarbon fuel to create electricity.



## FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **EXECUTIVE BRANCH**

#### OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The OLS estimates that the bill will increase annual State expenditures from the design, production, and issuance of special windshield stickers for electric vehicles. The OLS pegs the cost increase at \$20,000 in the first effective year and at a maximum of \$10,000 in each of the second and third effective year. The cost will be the highest in year one when presumably all existing electric vehicles will also receive a sticker. Thereafter, the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission will only issue windshield stickers to newly registered electric vehicles.

In arriving at these cost projections, the OLS assumes that the commission will be able to design, produce, and issue special windshield stickers at a cost of \$0.05 to \$0.10 per sticker. This range is informed by the current Pennsylvania Department of Transportation contract for motor vehicle inspection stickers.

The demand assumptions, in turn, are based on New Jersey electric vehicle registration trends. Notably, the OLS assumes that in the first effective year, about 255,000 stickers will be needed. This number is the sum of the approximately 140,000 electric vehicles that were registered in New Jersey as of June 30, 2024 plus an estimated additional 115,000 registrations combined in the year following the bill's date of enactment prior to its taking effect and in the first effective year. At a per-sticker cost of \$0.05 to \$0.10, the first-year cost will therefore range from \$12,800 to \$25,500.

For the second and third effective year, the OLS estimates that the annual number of needed stickers will not exceed 100,000. If so, then the cost in each of the second and third effective year will range from \$5,000 to \$10,000, assuming a per-sticker cost of \$0.05 to \$0.10.
