A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the federal Department of 1 2 Veterans Affairs to establish a Vet Center in Northwestern New 3 Jersey. 4 5 WHEREAS, Veterans in the State of New Jersey deserve high quality and accessible mental health care; and 6 7 WHEREAS, The United States has a long history of providing 8 assistance to veterans, beginning in the colonial era; and 9 WHEREAS, During the Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln signed a 10 law to establish a national soldiers and sailors asylum, creating the 11 blueprint for future VA hospitals; and 12 WHEREAS, In 1917, the United States Congress established a new system for veterans benefits, expanding services and providing 13 14 soldiers returning from World War I with access to newly 15 established hospitals that specifically addressed the needs of 16 veterans; and 17 WHEREAS, After World War II, the population of veterans increased, leading the United States Congress to enact new benefits for 18 19 veterans and to the modernization of the VA; and 20 WHEREAS, In 1979, the United States Congress recognized the mental health needs of veterans who had returned from Vietnam and 21 22 created Vet Centers to provide mental health and readjustment 23 services to veterans; and 24 WHEREAS, Vet Centers provide a broad range of counseling, outreach, 25 and referral services to eligible veterans in order to help the veteran 26 make a successful readjustment to civilian life; and 27 WHEREAS, Vet Centers provide veterans, service members, and their 28 families with readjustment counseling including individual and 29 group counseling, family counseling, bereavement counseling, 30 military sexual trauma counseling and referral, and substance abuse 31 assessment and referral, and with other medical and social services 32 to assist veterans; and 33 WHEREAS, Separate from VA sites to ensure confidentiality of 34 services and easy access to care, Vet Centers are located within the 35 community to best serve veterans, service members, and their 36 families; and 37 WHEREAS, There are currently five Vet Centers in New Jersey, none 38 of which are located in the northwestern part of the State; and 39 WHEREAS, As of September 30, 2020, the United States Department of Veterans Affairs has estimated that about 40,000 veterans reside 40 in Morris, Sussex, Warren, and Hunterdon counties; and 41 42 WHEREAS, The lack of a Vet Center in the northwestern part of the 43 State creates a burden on veterans, service members, and their 44 families who are forced to travel long distances or travel out of 45 State to receive much needed mental health services; now, 46 therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the State of New Jersey (the 1 2 General Assembly concurring): 3 4 1. The Legislature of the State of New Jersey respectfully urges 5 the federal Department of Veterans Affairs to establish a Vet Center 6 in Northwestern New Jersey. 7 2. Copies of this resolution, as filed with the Secretary of State, 8 9 shall be transmitted by the Secretary of the Senate to the Director of 10 the Veterans Affairs New Jersey Health Care System, to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, and every member of Congress from 11
