4	WHEREAS, July 16 is the anniversary of "Trinity," the first detonation
5	of an atomic weapon, which took place at Alamogordo Air Force
6	Base in New Mexico on July 16, 1945; and
7	WHEREAS, Atomic Veterans are American military service members
8	who participated in nuclear tests of atomic weapons between 1945
9	and 1962, served with United States military forces in or around
10	Hiroshima and Nagasaki through mid-1946, or were held as
11	prisoners of war in or near Hiroshima or Nagasaki; and
12	WHEREAS, Approximately 250,000 veterans of the United States,
13	including residents of New Jersey, witnessed and participated in at
14	least 235 atmospheric nuclear weapons tests; and
15	WHEREAS, Many Atomic Veterans were prevented by secrecy laws or
16	oaths from seeking medical care or disability compensation from
17	the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) for
18	conditions they may have developed as a result of radiation
19	exposure; and
20	WHEREAS, The National Association of Atomic Veterans was formed
21	in 1979 to help Atomic Veterans obtain medical care and
22	assistance; and
23	WHEREAS, In 1996, the United States Congress repealed the Nuclear
24	Radiation and Secrecy Agreements Act, freeing Atomic Veterans to
25	describe their military involvement in nuclear testing and to file for
26	VA benefits; and
27	WHEREAS, Although Congress repealed the Nuclear Radiation and
28	Secrecy Agreements Act, thousands of Atomic Veterans had
29	already died, their families never knowing the true extent of their
30	service; and
31	WHEREAS, Atomic Veterans patriotically served this country, meeting
32	the needs of national defense during a critical period in history; and
33	WHEREAS, This State designates July 16 of each year as Atomic
34	Veterans Day to honor the important role Atomic Veterans played
35	in the defense of our Nation; now, therefore,
36	
37	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
38	State of New Jersey:

40	1. a. July 16 of each year is designated as "Atomic Veterans
41	Day" in the State of New Jersey to honor the important role Atomic
42	Veterans played in the defense of our Nation.
43	b. The Governor is respectfully requested to issue an annual
44	proclamation calling upon public officials and citizens of this State
45	to observe "Atomic Veterans Day" with appropriate activities and
46	programs.

2. This joint resolution shall take effect immediately.

5	Atomic Veterans are American military service members who
6	participated in nuclear tests of atomic weapons between 1945 and

10	250,000 veterans of the United States, including residents of New

15	United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) for conditions
16	they may have developed as a result of radiation exposure. In 1996,
17	the United States Congress repealed the Nuclear Radiation and
18	Secrecy Agreements Act, freeing Atomic Veterans to describe their
19	military involvement in nuclear testing and to file for VA benefits.
20	Atomic Veterans patriotically served this country, meeting the
21	needs of national defense during a critical period in history. This
