14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. A new section of the Public School Code is
16	enacted to read:
17	"[NEW MATERIAL] TEACHER EVALUATION PILOT PROJECT
18	CREATEDPURPOSEDESIGNDATASCHOOL DISTRICTS SELECTED
19	A. The "teacher evaluation pilot project" is
20	created as a six-year study that allows selected school
21	districts to design and implement fair and equitable teacher
22	evaluation systems that:
23	(1) are developed by teachers, principals,
24	students, parents and community members;
25	(2) offer innovative and sustainable

1	evaluations that will improve each teacher's:
2	(a) pedagogical skills;
3	(b) classroom management style;
4	(c) teacher-student interactions; and
5	(d) collegial support and professional
6	development; and
7	(3) use short-cycle assessments to measure the
8	success of improving teaching performance that leads to greater
9	student academic or vocational and social achievement.
10	B. The teacher evaluation pilot project shall be
11	conducted in school districts selected by the department as
12	representing different size school districts, a mix of rural
13	and urban locations and a variety of school ratings; provided
14	that the school districts are large enough and diverse enough
15	to provide the data necessary to evaluate the pilot project. A
16	school district that participates in the pilot project is
17	exempt from the department's evaluation system during the term
18	of the pilot project.
19	C. Each teacher evaluation system designed for the
20	pilot project shall:
21	(l) include peer and principal observations
22	based on a research-based rubric;
23	(2) promote the learning of all students;
24	(3) support teacher professional development;
25	(4) measure student achievement and support

instruction that leads to higher levels of student achievement; and

- recognize significant differences in (5) assignments and responsibilities.
- D. The department shall establish data collection and reporting requirements for participating school districts. The department shall provide interim and final reports annually to the legislature and the governor on the efficacy of the pilot project."
