11 RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT; REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF  
12 FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION TO ESTABLISH A PROGRAM TO DISTRIBUTE  
13 FUNDS ALLOCATED FOR NEW MEXICO LAW ENFORCEMENT AND STATEWIDE  
14 LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

17 SECTION 1. Section 9-6-5.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2022,  
18 Chapter 56, Section 1) is amended to read:

19 "9-6-5.3. DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS.--

20 A. The department of finance and administration  
21 shall establish a program to distribute funds for local law  
22 enforcement agencies to provide recruitment and retention  
23 stipends to law enforcement officers. The program shall  
24 establish criteria for distribution of funds appropriated for  
25 that purpose, prioritizing recruitment and retention of

1 personnel to increase investigative capacity. The program  
2 shall also establish appropriate guidelines on the use of those  
3 funds, including recruitment and retention stipends that may be  
4 distributed to:

5 ~~[A.]~~ (1) a person who is not certified as a  
6 law enforcement officer pursuant to the Law Enforcement  
7 Training Act upon employment with a law enforcement agency;  
8 provided that the recipient successfully obtains such  
9 certification;

10 ~~[B.]~~ (2) a person who is certified as a law  
11 enforcement officer pursuant to the Law Enforcement Training  
12 Act upon employment with a law enforcement agency; provided  
13 that the recipient remains employed with that agency for three  
14 months; and

15 ~~[C.]~~ (3) a person who is certified as a law  
16 enforcement officer pursuant to the Law Enforcement Training  
17 Act currently employed by a law enforcement agency; provided  
18 that the law enforcement officer remains employed with that law  
19 enforcement officer's current agency for one additional year.

20 B. The department of finance and administration  
21 shall establish a program to distribute funds to state and  
22 local law enforcement agencies to prevent crime and improve  
23 public safety. Law enforcement agencies may use the funds to  
24 provide recruitment and retention stipends to commissioned law  
25 enforcement officers or civilian personnel within the police
