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| 17 | BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: |
| 18 | SECTION 1. It is proposed to amend Article 4 of the |
| 19 | constitution of New Mexico by adding a new Section 43 to read: |
| 20 | "A. The "citizen commission on legislative |
| 21 | salaries" is established as an independent state agency for the |
| 22 | purpose of establishing, adjusting and limiting the salaries of |
| 23 | members of the legislature. |
| 24 | B. The citizen commission on legislative salaries |
| 25 | is composed of nine public members, not more than four of whom |

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shall belong to the same political party at the time of appointment, and whose appointments, terms and qualification shall be provided by law.

C. The citizen commission on legislative salaries shall review, research and consider salaries for members of the legislature, adopt a final report on its determination to establish, adjust or limit those salaries and file that report with the secretary of state on or before October 1, 2028 and at least every four years thereafter.

D. The salaries established or adjusted as adopted in a report of the commission shall become effective on the first full state employee pay period in July following the filing of the report with the secretary of state.

E. An affirmative vote of at least five members of the citizen commission on legislative salaries is required for adoption of a report of the commission establishing or adjusting salaries for members of the legislature.

F. A member of the citizen commission on legislative salaries shall serve without compensation, but is entitled to receive per diem and mileage as provided by law for similar boards and commissions."

SECTION 2. It is proposed to amend Article 4, Section 10 of the constitution of New Mexico to read:

"Each member of the legislature shall receive:

A. per diem at the [internal revenue service] per .229309.5

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1 diem rate set by the federal general services administration or 2 successor agency for federal employees and officials for the city of Santa Fe for each day's attendance during each session 3 4 of the legislature and the internal revenue service standard 5 mileage rate for each mile traveled in going to and returning from the seat of government by the usual traveled route, once 6 7 each session as defined by Article 4, Section 5 of this 8 constitution:

B. per diem expense and mileage at the same rates as provided in Subsection A of this section for service at meetings required by legislative committees established by the legislature to meet in the interim between sessions; [and]

C. a salary established or adjusted pursuant to Section 43 of this article; and

[C.] <u>D.</u> no other compensation, perquisite or allowance."

SECTION 3. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection at the next general election or at any special election prior to that date that may be called for that purpose.

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
