AN ACT relating to the administration of justice; restricting the use of strip and visual body cavity searches of persons who are arrested for a misdemeanor and children who are detained in custody; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1      **Section 1** of this bill prohibits the conduct of a strip search or visual body  
2 cavity search of a person who is arrested for a misdemeanor offense that does not  
3 involve a dangerous or deadly weapon, a controlled substance or violence, unless a  
4 peace officer determines, based on specific and articulable facts, that the person is  
5 concealing a weapon or other contraband. **Section 1** also provides that a strip  
6 search or visual body cavity search must not be conducted unless the supervising  
7 officer on duty authorizes the search in writing which states the facts and  
8 circumstances authorizing the search. **Section 1** further requires that a person  
9 conducting or present during a strip search or visual body cavity search be of the  
10 same sex as the person being searched and that the search be conducted in a private  
11 area of the jail or detention facility.

12     **Section 2** of this bill applies the same prohibitions and requirements on the use  
13 of a strip search or visual body cavity search to a child who is taken into custody  
14 and detained in a juvenile detention facility based on an allegation that the child is  
15 in need of supervision or has committed certain delinquent acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** Chapter 171 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3      *1. A person who is arrested for violating a county, city or  
4 town ordinance or state law which is punishable as a  
5 misdemeanor and which does not involve a controlled substance,  
6 the possession, use or threatened use of a dangerous or deadly  
7 weapon or the use or threatened use of force or violence against  
8 the victim must not be subjected to a strip search or visual body  
9 cavity search before being placed in the general population of a  
10 county, city or town jail or detention facility, unless a peace officer  
11 determines, based on specific and articulable facts, that  
12 reasonable suspicion exists that:*

13        *(a) The person is concealing a weapon or contraband; and  
14 (b) A strip search or visual body cavity search will result in the  
15 discovery of the weapon or contraband.*

16      *2. A strip search or visual body cavity search must not be  
17 conducted unless the supervising officer who is on duty at the time  
18 of the search has authorized the search in writing. The written  
19 authorization must state the specific and articulable facts and the  
20 circumstances which authorize the strip search or visual body  
21 cavity search.*

22      *3. Any person conducting or otherwise present during a strip  
23 search or visual body cavity search must be of the same sex as the  
24 person being searched, except for a physician or any licensed  
25 medical personnel.*

26      *4. All strip searches and visual body cavity searches must be  
27 conducted in an area of privacy so that the search cannot be  
28 observed by any person not participating in the search. A person is  
29 considered to be participating in the search if his or her official

5    Sec. 2. Chapter 62C of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
6    thereto a new section to read as follows:

7    *1. A child who is taken into custody and detained because the*  
8    *child is alleged to be delinquent or in need of supervision and who*  
9    *is not alleged to have committed an unlawful act which would*  
10   *have been a felony if committed by an adult or which involves a*  
11   *controlled substance, the possession, use or threatened use of a*  
12   *dangerous or deadly weapon or the use or threatened use of force*  
13   *or violence against the victim must not be subjected to a strip*  
14   *search or visual body cavity search before being placed in any*  
15   *facility for the detention of children, unless a peace officer*  
16   *determines, based on specific and articulable facts, that*  
17   *reasonable suspicion exists that:*

18      *(a) The child is concealing a weapon or contraband; and*

19      *(b) A strip search or visual body cavity search will result in the*  
20   *discovery of the weapon or contraband.*
