SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing pretrial release hearings. (BDR 14-911)

AN ACT relating to pretrial release hearings; excluding Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays for the purpose of calculating the 48-hour period in which a pretrial release hearing must occur after a person has been taken into custody; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest:**

1 Existing law requires a court to hold a pretrial release hearing, in open court or  
2 by means of remote communication, to determine the custody status of a person  
3 within 48 hours after the person has been taken into custody, unless good cause is  
4 shown by a party, in which case, the court is authorized to continue the pretrial  
5 release hearing. (NRS 178.4849) This bill provides that for the purpose of  
6 calculating the 48-hour period in which the pretrial release hearing must occur,  
7 Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays are excluded.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 178.4849 is hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:  
3 178.4849 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section and  
4 NRS 178.484 and 178.4847, a court shall, within 48 hours after a  
5 person has been taken into custody, *exclusive of Saturdays,*  
6 *Sundays and all days declared to be legal holidays pursuant to*  
7 *NRS 236.015*, hold a pretrial release hearing, in open court or by  
8 means of remote communication, to determine the custody status of



1 the person. The pretrial release hearing may be continued for good  
2 cause shown.

3 2. As used in this section, "remote communication" means  
4 communication through telephone or videoconferencing.

5 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
