

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 297—ASSEMBLYMEN ELLISON; PAUL ANDERSON, GRADY, HARDY, KIRNER, LIVERMORE, OSCARSON AND WHEELER

MARCH 15, 2013

Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor

SUMMARY—Makes various changes relating to industrial relations. (BDR 53-928)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility.

Effect on the State: No.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [~~omitted material~~] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to industrial relations; providing that the term “person” includes governmental entities for the purposes of certain fraudulent practices pertaining to industrial insurance; clarifying the definition of “police officer” for purposes relating to occupational diseases by replacing obsolete job titles with current job titles; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

Existing law prohibits a person from making or causing to be made false communications, statements or representations for the purposes of obtaining certain accident benefits. (NRS 616D.370) **Section 1** of this bill provides, for the purposes of that prohibition, that the term “person” includes certain governmental entities.

Existing law provides for the payment of workers’ compensation if, during the course of employment, an occupational disease is the cause of the disability or death of an employee. (Chapter 617 of NRS) Existing law defines the term “police officer” for the purposes of statutory provisions relating to occupational diseases. (NRS 617.135) **Section 2** of this bill makes technical changes to the definition of “police officer” to reflect the current job titles within the Department of Public Safety.



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 616D.370 is hereby amended to read as
2 follows:

3 616D.370 1. A person shall not, by any act or omission:

4 (a) Make a charge or cause it to be made knowing the charge to
5 be false, in whole or in part;

6 (b) Make or cause to be made a statement or representation for
7 use in obtaining or seeking to obtain authorization to provide
8 specific accident benefits pursuant to chapters 616A to 616D,
9 inclusive, or chapter 617 of NRS, knowing the statement or
10 representation to be false, in whole or in part; or

11 (c) Make or cause to be made a statement or representation for
12 use by another person to obtain accident benefits pursuant to
13 chapters 616A to 616D, inclusive, or chapter 617 of NRS, knowing
14 the statement or representation to be false, in whole or in part.

15 2. A person who violates any of the provisions of this section
16 shall be punished:

17 (a) If the amount of the charge or the value of the accident
18 benefits obtained or sought to be obtained was \$650 or more, for a
19 category D felony as provided in NRS 193.130. In addition to any
20 other penalty, the court shall order the person to pay restitution.

21 (b) If the amount of the charge or the value of the accident
22 benefits obtained or sought to be obtained was less than \$650, for a
23 misdemeanor, and must be sentenced to restore any accident
24 benefits so obtained, if it can be done, or tender payment for rent or
25 labor.

26 **3. As used in this section, "person" includes, without
27 limitation, a government, governmental agency and political
28 subdivision of a government.**

29 **Sec. 2.** NRS 617.135 is hereby amended to read as follows:

30 617.135 "Police officer" includes:

31 1. A sheriff, deputy sheriff, officer of a metropolitan police
32 department or city police officer;

33 2. A ~~chief, inspector, supervisor, commercial officer or
34 trooper of the Nevada Highway Patrol Division of the Department
35 of Public Safety;~~

36 3. ~~A chief, investigator or agent of the Investigation Division
37 of the Department of Public Safety;~~

38 4. ~~A chief, supervisor, investigator or training officer of the
39 Training Division of the Department of Public Safety;~~

40 5. ~~A chief or investigator of an office of the Department of
41 Public Safety that conducts internal investigations of employees of~~

3 — 6. A chief or investigator of the Department of Public Safety
4 whose duties include, without limitation:

7 (b) The provision of technology support services to the Director
8 and the divisions; lieutenant colonel, major, captain, lieutenant,
9 sergeant or officer of the Department of Public Safety;

10 ¶ 3. An officer or investigator of the Section for the Control
11 of Emissions From Vehicles and the Enforcement of Matters
12 Related to the Use of Special Fuel of the Department of Motor
13 Vehicles;

14 ¶ 4. An investigator of the Division of Compliance
15 Enforcement of the Department of Motor Vehicles;

16 ¶ 5. A member of the police department of the Nevada
17 System of Higher Education;

18 ¶ 6. A:

19 (a) Uniformed employee of; or

20 (b) Forensic specialist employed by,

21 → the Department of Corrections whose position requires regular
22 and frequent contact with the offenders imprisoned and subjects the
23 employee to recall in emergencies;

24 ¶ 11. A parole and probation officer of the Division of Parole
25 and Probation of the Department of Public Safety;

26 ¶ 12. 7. A forensic specialist or correctional officer employed
27 by the Division of Mental Health and Developmental Services of the
28 Department of Health and Human Services at facilities for mentally

33 9. A game warden of the Department of Wildlife who has the
34 powers of a peace officer pursuant to NRS 289.280; and

37 has the powers of a peace officer pursuant to NRS 289.260.
