SUMMARY—Requires employees that use certain self-service devices to pay a fee. (BDR 53-959)

AN ACT relating to unemployment compensation; requiring an employer that uses certain self-service devices to pay a fee; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires employers to pay quarterly unemployment contributions that are based on wages paid to employees to the Administrator of the Employment Security Division of the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation for deposit in the Unemployment Compensation Fund. (NRS 612.535) Section 1 of this bill requires employers that utilize certain self-service devices operated by a customer to enter prices and complete a purchase transaction to pay a quarterly fee to the Administrator for each device in an amount equal to the average unemployment contribution per employee. Section 1 also requires the fees collected to be deposited in the Unemployment Compensation Administration Fund which is used to defray the cost of administering provisions relating to unemployment compensation. (See NRS 612.605)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 612 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

Each calendar quarter, an employer which uses a selfservice terminal, kiosk or other device operated by a customer to enter the purchase price of an item and complete a purchase transaction shall pay a fee to the Administrator for each selfservice terminal, kiosk or other device in an amount equal to the

average contribution per employee payable by the employer 2 pursuant to NRS 612.535.

2. All payments collected pursuant to this section must be deposited in the Unemployment Compensation Administration Fund created by to NRS 612.605.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.
