ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 430–COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES, AGRICULTURE, AND MINING

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing channel clearing. (BDR 48-1130)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to navigable rivers; requiring the State Engineer to create and maintain a list of certain proposed maintenance or other projects for a navigable river; authorizing certain public entities to submit proposed projects and apply for a grant; making an appropriation to the Account for the Channel Clearance, Maintenance, Restoration, Surveying and Monumenting Program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law establishes the Channel Clearance, Maintenance, Restoration, Surveying and Monumenting Program within the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to provide matching grants to local government agencies for the clearance, maintenance, restoration, surveying and monumenting of navigable rivers. Section 1 of this bill requires the State Engineer to maintain a list of proposed projects and the estimated cost of each proposed project. Section 1 also authorizes any public entity to propose a project and apply for a grant. Section 2 of this bill makes a \$250,000 appropriation to restore the balance of the Account for the Channel Clearance, Maintenance, Restoration, Surveying and Monumenting Program which funds these grants.





THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 532.220 is hereby amended to read as follows: 1 2 532.220 1. The Channel Clearance. Maintenance. Restoration, Surveying and Monumenting Program is hereby 3 4 established within the Division of Water Resources of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and must be 5 6 administered by the State Engineer.

7 2. This Program is to aid local governments in this state in the 8 clearance, maintenance, restoration, surveying and monumenting of 9 navigable rivers.

10 3. The State Engineer shall create and maintain a list of proposed projects for channel clearance, snagging, maintenance, 11 12 restoration, surveying or monumenting of a navigable river. The list must include, without limitation, the estimated costs of each 13 proposed project. Any incorporated city, county or other political 14 subdivision or public entity of this state, including, without 15 limitation, a water district or water authority, may submit a 16 proposed project for inclusion on the list. The submittal of a 17 18 proposed project does not guarantee the approval of or award of 19 a grant for the project.

4. Any incorporated city, county or other political subdivision
or public entity of this State, including, without limitation, a water
district or water authority, may apply to the State Engineer for a
grant under this program to fund a project that has been included
on the list pursuant to subsection 3, if the incorporated city, county
or other political subdivision or public entity requesting the money
agrees to match the state grant equally.

[4.] 5. The State, its departments, divisions and agencies, an 27 incorporated city, a county and all other political subdivisions or 28 public entities of this state, and their employees and agents, are 29 immune from civil liability for damages caused by an alteration or 30 disturbance of a riverbed or flooding sustained as a result of any act 31 or omission by an employee or agent in clearing or causing to be 32 33 cleared, maintaining or restoring a channel of a river pursuant to this 34 section if the channel is cleared, maintained or restored pursuant to a 35 permit granted by the Division of State Lands of the State 36 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and such other 37 permits and approvals as are required by law.

38 [5.] 6. The Division of State Lands and the Division of 39 Environmental Protection of the State Department of Conservation 40 and Natural Resources shall refund the application or permit fees, if 41 any, paid by a governmental entity to apply for a state permit to





perform channel clearance, maintenance, restoration, surveying and
 monumenting if:

3 (a) The governmental entity applies for the applicable permits 4 from the Division of State Lands and from the Division of 5 Environmental Protection of the State Department of Conservation 6 and Natural Resources;

7 (b) The governmental entity obtains all other permits and 8 approvals as are required by law;

9 (c) The governmental entity applies for a grant pursuant to 10 subsection 3; and

(d) The grant is denied for lack of money in the Account for the
 Channel Clearance, Maintenance, Restoration, Surveying and
 Monumenting Program after:

14 (1) The State Engineer requests an allocation from the 15 Contingency Account pursuant to subsection 4 of NRS 532.230; and

16 (2) An allocation from the Contingency Account is not made 17 within 90 days after the request is made.

18 [6.] 7. A state permit must not be denied for lack of money in
 19 the Account for the Channel Clearance, Maintenance, Restoration,
 20 Surveying and Monumenting Program.

21 [7.] 8. As used in this section, "navigable river" means a river 22 or stream that is used, or is susceptible of being used, in its ordinary 23 condition for trade or travel in the customary modes of trade or 24 travel on rivers or streams.

Sec. 2. There is hereby appropriated from the State General
Fund to the Account for the Channel Clearance, Maintenance,
Restoration, Surveying and Monumenting Program created by NRS
532.230 the sum of \$250,000 to restore the balance in the account.

29 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2015.
