SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the persons responsible for a child's welfare. (BDR 38-192)

AN ACT relating to child welfare; revising provisions concerning the persons responsible for a child's welfare; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law specifies when a person is responsible for a child's welfare. (NRS 432B.130) This bill clarifies that a public or private home, institution or facility is responsible for a child's welfare if the child resides or receives care at the home, institution or facility.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 432B.130 is hereby amended to read as follows:

432B.130 A person is responsible for a child's welfare under the provisions of this chapter if the person is the child's parent, guardian, a stepparent with whom the child lives, an adult person continually or regularly found in the same household as the child, for a person directly responsible or serving as a volunteer for or employed in a public or private home, institution or facility where the child actually resides or is receiving [ehild] care outside of the home for *all or* a portion of the day [.], or a person directly
