## ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 85–COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

PREFILED JANUARY 27, 2017

Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services

SUMMARY—Requires instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator in certain schools. (BDR 34-569)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Yes.

AN ACT relating to education; making mandatory instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator provided by certain public schools and private schools; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires instruction in certain cardiopulmonary resuscitation techniques and the use of an automated external defibrillator to be provided, to the extent money is available, as part of a course of study in health taught to pupils in public middle schools, junior high schools and high schools. (NRS 389.021) Existing law similarly requires such a course of study to be provided at a private secondary school to the extent that money is available for that purpose. Sections 1 and 2 of this bill remove the condition that money is available for that purpose to make such instruction mandatory in those public and private schools. Section 2 of this bill extends this requirement to private schools.





## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 389.021 is hereby amended to read as follows: 2 389.021 1. The State Board shall adopt regulations 3 establishing courses of study and the grade levels for which the 4 courses of study apply for: 5 (a) The academic subjects set forth in NRS 389.018. A course of 6 study in health prescribed pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 3 of NRS 389.018 must, Ito the extent money is available for this 7 purpose,] for pupils enrolled in middle school, junior high school or 8 9 high school, including, without limitation, pupils enrolled in those grade levels at a charter school, include instruction in: 10 11 (1) The administration of hands-only or compression-only cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including a psychomotor skill-based 12 component, according to the guidelines of the American Red Cross 13 14 or American Heart Association; and (2) The use of an automated external defibrillator. 15 (b) Citizenship and physical training for pupils enrolled in high 16 17 school. 18 (c) Physiology, hygiene and, except as otherwise prescribed by 19 paragraph (a), cardiopulmonary resuscitation. 20 (d) The prevention of suicide. 21 (e) Instruction relating to child abuse. 22 (f) The economics of the American system of free enterprise. 23 (g) American Sign Language. 24 (h) Environmental education. 25 (i) Adult roles and responsibilities. A course of study established for paragraph (a) may include one 26 or more of the subjects listed in paragraphs (b) to (i), inclusive. 27 If a course of study in health in middle school, junior high 28 2. 29 school or high school includes instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator: 30 (a)] A teacher who provides [the] instruction pursuant to 31 *paragraph (a) of subsection 1* is not required to hold certification in 32 33 the administration of cardiopulmonary resuscitation unless required 34 by the board of trustees of the school district pursuant to NRS 35 391.092 or by the governing body of the charter school. **(b)** 3. The board of trustees of the school district, for the 36 governing body of the charter school or the governing body of the 37 university school for profoundly gifted pupils may collaborate with 38 entities to assist in the provision of the instruction required 39

40 *pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection 1* and the provision of 41 equipment necessary for the instruction, including, without



1 limitation, fire departments, hospitals, colleges and universities and 2 public health agencies.

(c) 4. A pupil who is enrolled in a course of study in health 3 4 through a program of distance education or a pupil with a disability 5 who cannot perform the tasks included in the instruction *required* pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection 1 is not required to 6 7 complete the instruction to pass the course of study in health.

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**Sec. 2.** NRS 394.130 is hereby amended to read as follows:

9 394.130 1. In order to secure uniform and standard work for 10 pupils in private schools in this State, instruction in the subjects 11 required by law for pupils in the public schools shall be required of 12 pupils receiving instruction in such private schools, either under the 13 regular state courses of study prescribed by the Board or under 14 courses of study prepared by such private schools and approved by 15 the Board.

16 2. A course of study in health provided at a private secondary 17 school must include, Ito the extent money is available for this 18 purpose and for the grade levels determined by the private school, 19 instruction in:

(a) The administration of hands-only or compression-only 20 21 cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including a psychomotor skill-based 22 component, according to the guidelines of the American Red Cross 23 or American Heart Association: and

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(b) The use of an automated external defibrillator.

25 3. If a course of study in health in a private secondary school 26 includes instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of 27 an automated external defibrillator:

(a) A teacher who provides [the] instruction required pursuant 28 to subsection 2 is not required to hold certification in the 29 30 administration of cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

31 (b) 4. The private school may collaborate with entities to assist in the provision of the instruction required pursuant to 32 33 subsection 2 and the provision of equipment necessary for the 34 instruction. including, without limitation, fire departments. 35 hospitals, colleges and universities and public health agencies.

36 (c) 5. A pupil who is enrolled in a course of study in health 37 through a program of distance education or a pupil with a disability 38 who cannot perform the tasks included in the instruction *required* 39 *pursuant to subsection 2* is not required to complete the instruction 40 to pass the course of study in health.

41 Such private schools shall be required to furnish from **[4.] 6.** time to time such reports as the Superintendent of Public Instruction 42 43 may find necessary as to enrollment, attendance and general 44 progress within such schools. 45

<del>[5.]</del> 7. Nothing in this section shall be so construed as:





1 (a) To interfere with the right of the proper authorities having 2 charge of private schools to give religious instruction to the pupils 3 enrolled therein.

(b) To give such private schools any right to share in the public
school funds apportioned for the support of the public schools of
this State.

7 Sec. 3. The provisions of NRS 354.599 do not apply to any 8 additional expenses of a local government that are related to the 9 provisions of this act.

10 Sec. 4. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2017.
