## ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 6–ASSEMBLYMEN SUMMERS-ARMSTRONG, THOMAS, GONZÁLEZ; BROWN-MAY, D'SILVA, DURAN, NGUYEN AND TAYLOR

SUMMARY—Directs the Joint Interim Standing Committee on the Judiciary to conduct a study relating to battery which constitutes domestic violence. (BDR R-840)

ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Joint Interim Standing Committee on the Judiciary to conduct a study relating to battery which constitutes domestic violence.

RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE SENATE CONCURRING, That the Joint Interim Standing Committee on the Judiciary is hereby directed to conduct a study during the 2023-2024 legislative interim relating to battery which constitutes domestic violence and is committed by strangulation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the study must include, without limitation, an examination of:

- 1. The manner in which battery which constitutes domestic violence and is committed by strangulation is prosecuted in this State, including, without limitation:
- (a) The number of defendants charged with such a crime and, of those defendants, the number:
  - (1) Who plead guilty or no contest to the charge;
  - (2) Whose charges were dismissed; and
  - (3) Who stood trial on the charges; and
- (b) The outcomes of trials in which defendants are charged with battery which constitutes domestic violence and is committed by strangulation;
  - 2. The number of:



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- (a) Alleged victims of domestic violence who receive a forensic strangulation examination; and
- (b) Defendants accused of battery which constitutes domestic violence and is committed by strangulation by an alleged victim who received a forensic strangulation examination and whose charges were dismissed or who stood trial and were found not guilty of the crime;
- 3. The willingness of alleged victims of domestic violence to aid in the prosecution of battery which constitutes domestic violence and is committed by strangulation, including, without limitation, the number of alleged victims who:
  - (a) Recant testimony relating to an alleged strangulation; and
- (b) Fail to appear at a legal proceeding relating to an alleged strangulation; and
- 4. Whether any laws concerning strangulation should be revised; and be it further

RESOLVED, That any recommended legislation proposed by the Committee must be approved by a majority of the members of the Senate and a majority of the members of the Assembly appointed to the Committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Committee, pursuant to subsection 4 of NRS 218E.330, shall prepare and submit a report of the study and any recommendations for legislation to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the 83rd Session of the Nevada Legislature; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this resolution becomes effective upon adoption.
