SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to Medicaid. (BDR S-951)

AN ACT relating to Medicaid; requiring the establishment of a specific billing category and methodology for reimbursing clinics that provide certain services to children under Medicaid; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Department of Health and Human Services to administer the Medicaid program. (NRS 422.270) This bill requires the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department to establish: (1) a specific category of provider for purposes of billing and reimbursement under Medicaid for clinics that provide services primarily to children with cancer and rare diseases; and (2) billing guidelines and a rate methodology for such clinics that are consistent with prevailing best practices for reimbursing such clinics.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. On or before October 1, 2023, the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human Services shall, to the extent that federal participation is available:

1. Amend the *Medicaid Services Manual* to create a specific billing category as a type of special clinic for clinics that provide services primarily to children with cancer and rare diseases; and



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2. Establish billing guidelines and a rate methodology for clinics described in subsection 1 that are consistent with prevailing best practices for reimbursing such clinics.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.





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
