SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to education. (BDR 34-790)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets {omitted material} is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to community colleges; authorizing the Board of Regents of the Nevada System of Higher Education to award a scholarship to certain students who are enrolled in such colleges; establishing certain requirements to be eligible to receive such a scholarship; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law establishes the Nevada Promise Scholarship Program to award
 scholarships to graduating high school students to attend community colleges in
 this State. (NRS 396.961-396.9685) This bill similarly establishes the Nevada
 Reconnect Scholarship Program for adults to attend community colleges in this
 State. Section 9 of this bill establishes the Nevada Reconnect Scholarship Account
 in the State General Fund to pay for the scholarships.
 Section 10 of this bill requires the Board of Regents of the Nevada System of
 Higher Education to administer the Program, including adopting certain
 regulations. Section 13 of this bill sets forth the requirements for a student to be

Section 10 of this bill requires the Board of Regents of the Nevada System of Higher Education to administer the Program, including adopting certain regulations. Section 13 of this bill sets forth the requirements for a student to be eligible to receive a Nevada Reconnect Scholarship. The requirements to receive a scholarship include a requirement that an applicant complete community service. Section 13.5 of this bill authorizes the Board of Regents to grant a student a leave of absence from the Program under certain circumstances and waive certain requirements for eligibility in the Program for a student who has been granted a leave of absence.

**Section 16** of this bill prescribes: (1) the process for determining the eligibility of scholarship applicants and awarding scholarships; and (2) the amount of a scholarship for a recipient. If there is insufficient money available to award a full scholarship to all eligible students, **section 16** sets forth the manner in which

- appropriation for the purpose of awarding Nevada Reconnect Scholarships.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 1 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 17, inclusive, of this 3 act.

Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 17, inclusive, of this act, 4 5 unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in sections 2.5 to 5.7, inclusive, of this act have the meanings 6 7 ascribed to them in those sections.

8 Sec. 2.5. "Academic year" means two consecutive semesters, 9 beginning with a fall semester, and one summer academic term at 10 a community college.

"Gift aid" means a federal Pell grant, a Federal 11 Sec. 3. Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, a Governor Guinn 12 Millennium Scholarship awarded pursuant to NRS 396.911 to 13 396.945, inclusive, a grant awarded under the Silver State 14 **Opportunity Grant Program pursuant to NRS 396.950 to 396.960**, 15 inclusive, or a Nevada Promise Scholarship awarded pursuant to 16 17 NRS 396.961 to 396.9685, inclusive.

**Sec. 4.** (Deleted by amendment.) 18

*"Nevada* 19 Sec. 5. Reconnect Scholarship" means a 20 scholarship awarded by the Board of Regents pursuant to section 21 16 of this act.

22 Sec. 5.3. "Program" the Nevada means Reconnect 23 Scholarship Program created by section 10 of this act.

Sec. 5.7. "Registration fee and other mandatory fees" means 24 a registration fee assessed per credit and mandatory fees assessed 25 per credit that are approved by the Board of Regents and charged 26 to all students by a community college. The term does not include 27 special course fees or fees charged for specific programs of study, 28 books or supplies even if such fees are considered necessary for 29

30 enrollment.

The Nevada Reconnect Scholarship Program 34 Sec. 9. 1. 35 Account is hereby created in the State General Fund. The Account must be administered by the State Treasurer. 36





1 2. The interest and income earned on:

2 (a) The money in the Account, after deducting any applicable 3 charges; and

4 (b) Unexpended appropriations made to the Account from the 5 State General Fund,

6 → must be credited to the Account.

7 3. Any money remaining in the Account at the end of a fiscal 8 year, including, without limitation, any unexpended 9 appropriations made to the Account from the State General Fund, 10 does not revert to the State General Fund, and the balance in the 11 Account must be carried forward to the next fiscal year.

12 4. The State Treasurer may accept gifts and grants of money 13 from any source for deposit in the Account.

**Sec. 10.** 1. The Nevada Reconnect Scholarship Program is hereby created for the purpose of awarding Nevada Reconnect Scholarships to eligible students to pay for the difference between the amount of the registration fee and other mandatory fees charged to a student by a community college for the academic year and the total amount of any other gift aid received by the student for the academic year.

26 2. The Board of Regents shall administer the Program.

27 3. In administering the Program, the Board of Regents shall 28 adopt regulations governing:

29 (a) The procedures and standards for determining the 30 eligibility of a student for a Nevada Reconnect Scholarship 31 pursuant to section 13 of this act.

32 (b) An application process administered through the 33 community colleges which allows a student to participate in the 34 Program.

35 (c) Deadlines for a student to satisfy the requirements for 36 eligibility in the Program.

(d) A training program administered through the community
colleges which allows a student to satisfy the requirements of
paragraph (g) of subsection 1 of section 13 of this act.

40 (e) Procedures which allow a student to participate in the 41 mentoring program established pursuant to NRS 396.9655.

42 (f) The criteria for completing the community service 43 requirements of paragraph (i) of subsection 1 of section 13 of this 44 act.





1 (g) Procedures which allow a student to appeal any adverse 2 decision concerning his or her eligibility to receive a Nevada 3 Reconnect Scholarship.

4 (h) Procedures for a community college to accept gifts, grants
5 and donations from any source for the purposes of carrying out its
6 duties under the Program as prescribed by the Board of Regents.

7 4. The Board of Regents may adopt regulations authorizing a 8 community college to enter into an agreement with one or more 9 nonprofit organizations or governmental entities to conduct any 10 activities required by the Board of Regents for a training program 11 which allows a student to satisfy the requirements of paragraph 12 (g) of subsection 1 of section 13 of this act.

13 5. The Board of Regents may adopt any other regulations 14 necessary to carry out the Program.

17 Sec. 13. 1. To be eligible to receive a Nevada Reconnect 18 Scholarship, a student must:

19 (a) Be a bona fide resident of this State, as construed in 20 NRS 396.540.

21 (b) Have not previously been awarded an associate's degree or 22 a bachelor's degree.

(c) Have obtained a high school diploma or have successfully
 completed the high school equivalency assessment selected by the
 State Board pursuant to NRS 390.055.

26 (d) Complete the application for the Nevada Reconnect 27 Scholarship Program in accordance with the regulations 28 prescribed by the Board of Regents.

(e) Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid
provided for by 20 U.S.C. § 1090 for each academic year of
participation in the Program on or before the deadline prescribed
by the Board of Regents.

(f) Be considered an independent student on the student's
Free Application for Federal Student Aid provided for by 20
U.S.C. § 1090.

(g) Before enrolling in a community college, participate in one
training meeting related to financial aid, the Free Application for
Federal Student Aid and college orientation, as prescribed by the
Board of Regents by regulation.

40 (h) Have met at least once with an academic counselor before 41 enrollment for the first semester of enrollment at a community 42 college and at least once for each semester while participating in 43 the Program.

(i) Complete at least 8 hours of community service before the
 first semester of enrollment at a community college and at least 8





hours of community service each semester thereafter, 1 not including summer academic terms, while participating in the 2 3 **Program**. Community service performed to satisfy the requirements of this paragraph must not include religious 4 5 proselytizing or service for which the student receives any type of 6 compensation or which directly benefits a member of the family of 7 the student.

8 (j) Submits all information deemed necessary by the Board of 9 Regents to determine the student's eligibility for gift aid.

10 (k) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, be enrolled 11 in at least 6 semester credit hours in a program of study leading to 12 a recognized degree or certificate at a community college for each 13 fall and spring semester beginning with the first semester for 14 which the student received a Nevada Reconnect Scholarship, not 15 including summer academic terms. A student who is on schedule 16 to graduate at:

17 (1) The end of a semester may enroll in the number of 18 semester credit hours required to graduate.

19 (2) The end of a fall semester is not required to enroll in 20 credit hours for the spring semester.

(1) Meet satisfactory academic progress, as defined by federal
requirements established pursuant to Title IV of the Higher
Education Act of 1965, 20 U.S.C. §§ 1001 et seq., and determined
by the community college in which the student is enrolled.

25 2. The Board of Regents shall establish criteria with respect 26 to students who have a documented physical or mental disability 27 or who were previously subject to an individualized education 28 program under the Individuals with Disabilities Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 29 1400 et seq., or a plan under Title V of the Rehabilitation Act of 30 1973, 29 U.S.C. §§ 791 et seq. The criteria must provide an 31 exemption for those students from:

(a) The limitation on eligibility for a Nevada Reconnect
Scholarship set forth in paragraph (b) of subsection 3; and

34 (b) The minimum number of credits prescribed in paragraph
35 (k) of subsection 1.

36 3. A student who meets the requirements of subsection 1 is
37 eligible for a Nevada Reconnect Scholarship from the Program
38 until the occurrence of the first of the following events:

39 (a) The student is awarded an associate's degree or bachelor's 40 degree; or

41 (b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the student 42 has:

43 (1) Completed 6 semesters towards earning an associate's 44 degree or certificate; or





(2) Completed 12 semesters towards earning a bachelor's
 degree.
 Sec. 13.5. 1. The Board of Regents may grant a leave of

absence from the Program to a student upon request. A student
may request a leave of absence for:

6 (a) An illness or serious medical problem of the student or a
7 member of the student's immediate family;

8 (b) Extreme financial hardship for the student or a member of 9 the student's immediate family;

10 (c) Engaging in any activity required or encouraged for 11 members of the student's religious faith;

12 (d) Mobilization of the student's unit of the Armed Forces of 13 the United States or National Guard; or

14 (e) Any other extraordinary circumstances beyond the control 15 of the student that would create a substantial hardship for the 16 student, as determined by the Board of Regents.

17 2. If the Board of Regents grants a leave of absence to a 18 student, the Board of Regents shall:

19 (a) Make a determination in accordance with regulations 20 adopted by the Board of Regents as to which requirements for 21 eligibility in the Program set forth in section 13 of this act are 22 appropriated to waive for the student; and

23 (b) Waive requirements for eligibility as determined pursuant 24 to paragraph (a) for the student for the length of the leave of 25 absence.

26 **3.** The Board of Regents shall adopt regulations establishing:

(a) Procedures for a student to request a leave of absence
pursuant to subsection 1; and

29 (b) Criteria for determining appropriate requirements for 30 eligibility to waive for a student who has been granted a leave of 31 absence pursuant to subsection 2.

34 Sec. 16. 1. The Board of Regents shall award Nevada 35 Reconnect Scholarships in accordance with this section to 36 students who are enrolled at a community college and are eligible 37 to receive such scholarships under the provisions of section 13 of 38 this act.

39 2. For each eligible student, the Board of Regents shall:

40 (a) Calculate the maximum amount of a Nevada Reconnect
41 Scholarship which the student is eligible to receive based on
42 criteria established by regulation pursuant to this section.

(b) Determine the actual amount of the Nevada Reconnect
Scholarship, if any, which will be awarded to the student, which
must not exceed the maximum amount calculated pursuant to





1 paragraph (a), but which may be in a lesser amount if the Board 2 of Regents receives notice from the State Treasurer pursuant to 3 subsection 3 that the money available in the Nevada Reconnect Scholarship Account for any semester is insufficient to award to 4 5 all eligible students the maximum amount of a Nevada Reconnect 6 Scholarship which each student is eligible to receive.

7 (c) If the student is to receive a Nevada Reconnect 8 Scholarship, award the student a Nevada Reconnect Scholarship in the amount determined pursuant to paragraph (b). The Board 9 10 of Regents shall disburse the amount of the Nevada Reconnect 11 Scholarship awarded to the student, on behalf of the student, 12 directly to the community college in which the student is enrolled.

13 3. The Board of Regents shall submit a request for a disbursement from the Nevada Reconnect Scholarship Account 14 15 created by section 9 of this act for the maximum amount of money that will be required to fund a scholarship for each eligible 16 17 student. Within the limits of money available in the Nevada Reconnect Scholarship Account, the State Treasurer shall 18 disburse the amount requested to the Board of Regents for 19 20 disbursement to each community college. If there is insufficient 21 money in the Account to disburse that amount to each community 22 college, the State Treasurer shall provide notice that insufficient 23 money remains in the Nevada Reconnect Scholarship Account to 24 the Board of Regents. The State Treasurer shall include in the notice the amount of money available for the award of Nevada 25 26 **Reconnect** Scholarships for the academic year and request that a 27 new request be submitted. 28

4. The Board of Regents shall adopt regulations prescribing:

29 (a) The criteria for determining the maximum amount of a Nevada Reconnect Scholarship for an eligible student which is 30 equal to the difference between the amount of the registration fee 31 32 and other mandatory fees charged to the student by the community college in which the student is enrolled for the academic year, 33 excluding any amount of those fees that is waived by the 34 community college in which the student is enrolled, and the total 35 amount of any other gift aid received by the student for the 36 37 academic year.

38 (b) The procedures for submitting a request for disbursement 39 from the Nevada Reconnect Scholarship Account.

40 (c) The procedures and standards for determining the actual amount of the Nevada Reconnect Scholarship which will be 41 42 awarded to each student upon receiving notice that there is insufficient money to award all eligible students the maximum 43 44 amount of the scholarship which each student is eligible to 45 receive. Such procedures and standards may include, without





1 limitation, administration of the Program on a first-come, first-2 served basis for all students eligible to participate in the Program.

3 (d) Procedures to ensure that all money from a Nevada
4 Reconnect Scholarship awarded to a student that is refunded in
5 whole or in part for any reason is refunded to the Nevada
6 Reconnect Scholarship Account and not the student.

7 Sec. 17. 1. On or before August 1 of each year, the Board 8 of Regents shall:

9 (a) Review all Nevada Reconnect Scholarships awarded for the 10 immediately preceding academic year;

11 (b) Compile a report for the immediately preceding academic 12 vear. which must include the number of students who applied for a 13 scholarship, the number of students who received a scholarship, 14 the total cost associated with the award of Nevada Reconnect Scholarships, the total number of hours of community service 15 16 performed pursuant to section 13 of this act, the graduation rate of 17 students who received a scholarship and the scholarship retention 18 rate: and

(c) Submit the report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel
 Bureau for transmittal to:

21 (1) In even-numbered years, the next regular session of the 22 Legislature; and

23 (2) In odd-numbered years, the Legislative Committee on
 24 Education.

25 2. As used in this section, "scholarship retention rate" means 26 the percentage of students who received a scholarship for the 27 academic year immediately preceding the academic year to which 28 a report compiled pursuant to subsection 1 pertains who did not 29 graduate by the end of that academic year and who also received a 30 Nevada Reconnect Scholarship for the academic year to which the 31 report pertains.

**Sec. 19.** There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Nevada Reconnect Scholarship Account created by section 9 of this act for the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 the sum of \$1,750,000 for the purpose of awarding Nevada Reconnect Scholarships pursuant to sections 2 to 17, inclusive, of this act.

**Sec. 20.** 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 17 of this act, the initial report compiled by the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada pursuant to subsection 1 of section 17 of this act:

42 (a) Must be submitted on or before August 1, 2021, and must
43 provide information concerning the 2019-2020 school year; and

44 (b) Is not required to include the overall graduation rate of 45 scholarship recipients, the graduation rate of scholarship recipients,





1 the overall scholarship retention rate or the scholarship retention rate 2 for students.

3 **Sec. 21.** The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 218D.380 do 4 not apply to any provision of this act which adds or revises a 5 requirement to submit a report to the Legislature.

6 Sec. 22. 1. This section and sections 2 to 15, inclusive, 17, 7 18, 20 and 21 of this act become effective upon passage and 8 approval for the purpose of adopting regulations and performing any 9 other preparatory administrative tasks that are necessary to carry out 10 the provisions of this act and on July 1, 2019, for all other purposes.

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2. Section 19 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.

3. Section 16 of this act becomes effective upon passage and
approval for the purpose of adopting regulations and performing any
other preparatory administrative tasks that are necessary to carry out
the provisions of this act and on July 1, 2020, for all other purposes.
