SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to the protection of older
persons, vulnerable persons and persons in need of a
guardian. (BDR 15-965)

AN ACT relating to the protection of certain persons; revising provisions relating to the imposition of an additional penalty upon a person who commits certain crimes or criminal violations of law against an older person or a vulnerable person; revising provisions relating to immunity from civil or criminal liability for certain acts; increasing the maximum term of imprisonment for a person who commits certain acts against an older person or a vulnerable person that result in substantial bodily or mental harm to or the death of the person; revising the penalties for the abuse, neglect, exploitation, isolation or abandonment of an older person or a vulnerable person; establishing the Wards' Bill of Rights; requiring each court having jurisdiction of the persons and estates of minors, incompetent persons or persons of limited capacity to perform certain actions to ensure the Wards' Bill of Rights is available to the public; establishing provisions relating to certain arbitration clauses included in contracts used by facilities for long-term care; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law provides for the imposition of an additional penalty upon a person
2 who commits certain crimes or criminal violations of law against an older person or
3 a vulnerable person, and provides that the sentence prescribed runs consecutively
4 with the sentence prescribed by statute for the crime or criminal violation. (NRS
5 193.167) **Section 1.5** of this bill additionally provides that the sentence prescribed
6 must not exceed the sentence imposed for the crime or criminal violation.

7 Existing law extends immunity from civil or criminal liability to every person
8 who, in good faith: (1) participates in the making of a report concerning the abuse,
9 neglect, exploitation, isolation or abandonment of an older person or a vulnerable
10 person; (2) submits information contained in such a report to the licensing board; or
11 (3) causes or conducts an investigation of alleged abuse, neglect, exploitation,
12 isolation or abandonment of an older person or a vulnerable person. (NRS
13 200.5096) **Section 2** of this bill provides that such immunity does not extend to any
14 person who abused, neglected, exploited, isolated or abandoned the older person or
15 vulnerable person who is the subject of the report or investigation or any person
16 who committed certain other acts relating to the abuse, neglect, exploitation,
17 isolation or abandonment of the older person or vulnerable person.

18 Existing law establishes the penalties to be imposed upon a person who abuses,
19 neglects, exploits, isolates or abandons an older person or a vulnerable person. Any
20 person who has assumed responsibility to care for an older person or a vulnerable
21 person and who neglects the older person or vulnerable person or commits certain
22 other related acts, thereby causing substantial bodily or mental harm to or the death
23 of the older person or vulnerable person, is guilty of a category B felony and must
24 be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for a minimum term of not less
25 than 2 years and a maximum term of not more than 6 years. (NRS 200.5099)
26 **Section 3** of this bill increases the maximum term of imprisonment for the
27 commission of such acts from 6 years to 20 years. **Section 3** also revises the
28 penalties for the abuse, neglect, isolation or abandonment of an older person or a
29 vulnerable person and provides that: (1) the commission of a first offense is
30 punishable as a category C felony or a gross misdemeanor, as determined by the
31 court; and (2) the commission of a second or subsequent offense is punishable as a
32 category B felony. **Section 3** additionally revises the penalties for the exploitation
33 of an older person or a vulnerable person and provides that a person who commits
34 such an offense is guilty of: (1) either a category C felony or gross misdemeanor, as
35 determined by the court, for the first offense, or if the monetary value involved is
36 less than \$650 or cannot be determined; or (2) a category B felony for the second
37 and all subsequent offenses, or if the monetary value is \$650 or more.

38 Existing law also establishes the penalties to be imposed upon a person who
39 conspires with another to commit abuse, exploitation or isolation of an older person
40 or a vulnerable person. Such a person must be punished for a gross misdemeanor
41 for the first offense and for a category C felony for the second or subsequent
42 offense. (NRS 200.50995) **Section 3.5** of this bill increases the penalty for the
43 commission of a second or subsequent offense to a category B felony punishable by
44 imprisonment in the state prison for a minimum term of not less than 2 years and a
45 maximum term of not less than 20 years.

46 Existing law establishes provisions governing the appointment of a guardian for
47 a ward. (Chapter 159 of NRS) **Section 6** of this bill establishes the Wards' Bill of
48 Rights, which sets forth certain specific rights of wards. **Section 7** of this bill
49 requires each court having jurisdiction of the persons and estates of minors,
50 incompetent persons or persons of limited capacity to: (1) make the Wards' Bill of
51 Rights readily available to the public; (2) maintain a copy of the Wards' Bill of
52 Rights in the court for reproduction and distribution to the public; and (3) ensure
53 that the Wards' Bill of Rights is posted in a conspicuous place in the court and on
54 the court's Internet website.

55 **Section 7.5** of this bill: (1) provides that if a facility for long-term care wishes
56 to include as part of any contract relating to the provision of care a clause providing
57 that the parties to the contract agree to resolve any dispute through arbitration, the
58 clause must be included as an addendum to the contract; and (2) establishes
59 requirements pertaining to the form and content of such an addendum.

2 **Sec. 1.5.** NRS 193.167 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22 statute for the crime, and, if the crime is a felony, by imprisonment
23 in the state prison for a minimum term of not less than 1 year and a
24 maximum term of not more than 20 years.
25 2. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 193.169, any person
26 who commits a criminal violation of the provisions of chapter 90 or
27 91 of NRS against any person who is 60 years of age or older or
28 against a vulnerable person shall, in addition to the term of
29 imprisonment prescribed by statute for the criminal violation, be
30 punished, if the criminal violation is a misdemeanor or gross
31 misdemeanor, by imprisonment in the county jail for a term equal to
32 the term of imprisonment prescribed by statute for the criminal
33 violation, and, if the criminal violation is a felony, by imprisonment
34 in the state prison for a minimum term of not less than 1 year and a
35 maximum term of not more than 20 years.



1 3. In determining the length of the additional penalty imposed
2 pursuant to this section, the court shall consider the following
3 information:

- 4 (a) The facts and circumstances of the crime or criminal
5 violation;
6 (b) The criminal history of the person;
7 (c) The impact of the crime or criminal violation on any victim;
8 (d) Any mitigating factors presented by the person; and
9 (e) Any other relevant information.

10 ➔ The court shall state on the record that it has considered the
11 information described in paragraphs (a) to (e), inclusive, in
12 determining the length of the additional penalty imposed.

13 4. The sentence prescribed by this section ~~must run~~:

10 person or a vulnerable person as evidenced by an observable and
11 substantial impairment of the ability of the older person or
12 vulnerable person to function within his or her normal range of

35 **Sec. 6. 1.** *The Legislature hereby declares that, except as*
36 *otherwise specifically provided by law, each proposed ward has the*
37 *right to have an attorney before a guardianship is imposed to ask*
38 *the court for relief, and each ward has the right to:*

39 *(a) Have an attorney at any time during a guardianship to ask*
40 *the court for relief.*

41 *(b) Receive notice of all guardianship proceedings and all*
42 *proceedings relating to a determination of capacity unless the*
43 *court determines that the ward lacks the capacity to comprehend*
44 *such notice.*



1 (c) Receive a copy of all documents filed in a guardianship
2 proceeding.

3 (d) Have a family member, an interested party, a person of
4 natural affection, an advocate for the ward or a medical provider
5 speak or raise any issues of concern on behalf of the ward during
6 a court hearing, either orally or in writing, including, without
7 limitation, issues relating to a conflict with a guardian. As used in
8 this paragraph, "person of natural affection" means a person who
9 is not a family member of a ward but who shares a relationship
10 with the ward that is similar to the relationship between family
11 members.

12 (e) Be educated about guardianships and ask questions and
13 express concerns and complaints about a guardian and the actions
14 of a guardian, either orally or in writing.

15 (f) Participate in developing a plan for his or her care,
16 including, without limitation, managing his or her assets and
17 personal property and determining his or her residence and the
18 manner in which he or she will receive services.

19 (g) Have due consideration given to his or her current and
20 previously stated personal desires, preferences for health care and
21 medical treatment and religious and moral beliefs.

22 (h) Remain as independent as possible, including, without
23 limitation, to have his or her preference honored regarding his or
24 her residence and standard of living, either as expressed or
25 demonstrated before a determination was made relating to
26 capacity or as currently expressed, if the preference is reasonable
27 under the circumstances.

28 (i) Be granted the greatest degree of freedom possible,
29 consistent with the reasons for a guardianship, and exercise
30 control of all aspects of his or her life that are not delegated to a
31 guardian specifically by a court order.

32 (j) Engage in any activity that the court has not expressly
33 reserved for a guardian, including, without limitation, voting,
34 marrying or entering into a domestic partnership, traveling,
35 working and having a driver's license.

36 (k) Be treated with respect and dignity.

37 (l) Be treated fairly by his or her guardian.

38 (m) Maintain privacy and confidentiality in personal matters.

39 (n) Receive telephone calls and personal mail and have
40 visitors, unless his or her guardian and the court determine that
41 particular correspondence or a particular visitor will cause harm
42 to the ward.

43 (o) Receive timely, effective and appropriate health care and
44 medical treatment that does not violate his or her rights.



1 (p) *Have all services provided by a guardian at a reasonable*
2 *rate of compensation and have a court review any requests for*
3 *payment to avoid excessive or unnecessary fees or duplicative*
4 *billing.*

5 (q) *Receive prudent financial management of his or her*
6 *property and regular detailed reports of financial accounting,*
7 *including, without limitation, reports on any investments or trusts*
8 *that are held for his or her benefit and any expenditures or fees*
9 *charged to his or her estate.*

10 (r) *Receive and control his or her salary, maintain a bank*
11 *account and manage his or her personal money.*

12 (s) *Ask the court to:*

13 (1) *Review the management activity of a guardian if a*
14 *dispute cannot be resolved.*

15 (2) *Continually review the need for a guardianship or*
16 *modify or terminate a guardianship.*

17 (3) *Replace the guardian.*

18 (4) *Enter an order restoring his or her capacity at the*
19 *earliest possible time.*

20 2. *The rights of a ward set forth in subsection 1 do not*
21 *abrogate any remedies provided by law. All such rights may be*
22 *addressed in a guardianship proceeding or be enforced through a*
23 *private right of action.*

24 **Sec. 7.** *Each court shall:*

25 1. *Make the Wards' Bill of Rights readily available to the*
26 *public;*

27 2. *Maintain a copy of the Wards' Bill of Rights in the court*
28 *for reproduction and distribution to the public; and*

29 3. *Ensure that the Wards' Bill of Rights is posted:*

30 (a) *In a conspicuous place, in at least 12-point type, in the*
31 *court; and*

32 (b) *On the Internet website of the court.*

33 **Sec. 7.5.** Chapter 449 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
34 thereto a new section to read as follows:

35 1. *If a facility for long-term care wishes to include as part of*
36 *any contract relating to the provision of care a clause providing*
37 *that the parties to the contract agree to resolve any dispute*
38 *through arbitration, the clause must be included as an addendum*
39 *to the contract and:*

40 (a) *Be printed in large font on a separate page with a separate*
41 *signature line;*

42 (b) *Fully explain the effect of signing the addendum,*
43 *including, without limitation, that any dispute will be resolved*
44 *through the arbitration process instead of in court; and*



1 (c) *Clearly state that the person signing the contract is not*
2 *required to sign the addendum.*

3 2. *As used in this section, "facility for long-term care"*
4 *means:*

5 (a) *A residential facility for groups;*

6 (b) *A facility for intermediate care;*

7 (c) *A facility for skilled nursing;*

8 (d) *A home for individual residential care; and*

9 (e) *Any unlicensed establishment that provides food, shelter,*
10 *assistance and limited supervision to a resident.*

11 **Sec. 8.** The provisions of NRS 354.599 do not apply to any
12 additional expenses of a local government that are related to the
13 provisions of this act.

14 **Sec. 9.** 1. This section becomes effective upon passage and
15 approval.

16 2. Sections 4 to 7, inclusive, and 8 of this act become effective:

17 (a) Upon passage and approval for the purpose of performing
18 any preparatory administrative tasks that are necessary to carry out
19 the provisions of those sections; and

20 (b) On January 1, 2018, for all other purposes.

21 3. Sections 1 to 3.5, inclusive, and 7.5 of this act become
22 effective on October 1, 2017.
