### SENATE BILL NO. 450-COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

## MARCH 23, 2015

## Referred to Committee on Judiciary

SUMMARY—Establishes the Sports Pool Telecast Access Committee. (BDR 41-1139)

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets formitted material is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to gaming; requiring the Nevada Gaming Commission to create the Sports Pool Telecast Access Committee; establishing provisions relating to the appointment of members to the Committee; establishing provisions relating to the rights and duties of the Committee; authorizing the Commission to adopt regulations relating to the Committee; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

#### **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law establishes various provisions relating to the licensing and control of gaming in this State. (Chapter 463 of NRS) Section 7 of this bill requires the Nevada Gaming Commission to create the Sports Pool Telecast Access Committee. Section 7 sets forth provisions concerning the number and qualifications of members required to be appointed to the Committee by the Commission, the terms of those members and the procedure by which a vacancy of the Committee is filled. Section 8 of this bill requires the Commission to grant to the Committee, under certain circumstances, the exclusive right to negotiate an agreement for rates with the holder of an exclusive broadcast right to telecast a package of sporting events for which a sports pool in this State will accept wagers. Such an agreement: (1) is negotiated by the Committee on behalf of every sports pool licensed to operate in this State; (2) supersedes, under certain circumstances, any other agreement for the telecast of a package of sporting events entered into between the holder of the exclusive broadcast right and a sports pool; and (3) must be approved by the State Gaming Control Board. Section 8 also authorizes the Commission to adopt regulations as it deems necessary to carry out these provisions.



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# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 463 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act.
- Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in sections 3 to 6, inclusive, of this act have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.
- Sec. 3. "Cable operator" means a person or group of persons who:
- 1. Provide cable service over a cable system and, directly or through one or more affiliates, owns a significant interest in the cable system; or
- 2. Otherwise controls or is responsible for, through any arrangement, the management and operation of a cable system.
- Sec. 4. "Exclusive broadcast right" means the right, held by a single cable operator or provider of direct broadcast satellite service, to exclusively sell to commercial establishments in this State, as a package, licenses to receive broadcasts of sporting events conducted by a professional sports league and which is not otherwise available on an over-the-air network or channel included with a cable or satellite television subscription, including, without limitation, sporting events conducted by the National Football League, the National Basketball Association, the National Hockey League or Major League Baseball.
- Sec. 5. "Provider of direct broadcast satellite service" has the meaning ascribed to it in 47 U.S.C. § 335(b)(5)(A).
- Sec. 6. "Telecast Access Committee" or "Committee" means the Sports Pool Telecast Access Committee created pursuant to section 7 of this act.
- Sec. 7. 1. The Commission shall create the Sports Pool Telecast Access Committee. The Committee must consist of 11 members, each of whom must:
  - (a) Hold a nonrestricted gaming license; and
  - (b) Be licensed to operate a sports pool in this State.
  - 2. The Commission shall appoint to the Committee:
- (a) Five members from a list of nominees provided by the State Association of Gaming Establishments whose members collectively paid from the operation of a sports pool the most gross revenue fees to the State pursuant to NRS 463.370 in the immediately preceding fiscal year, as determined by records maintained by the Board;





(b) Three members who paid from the operation of a sports pool an amount of gross revenue fees to the State pursuant to NRS 463.380 in the immediately preceding fiscal year that was less than the average amount of gross revenue fees paid by all persons licensed to operate a sports pool, as determined by records maintained by the Board; and

(c) Three members who paid from the operation of a sports pool any amount of gross revenue fees to the State pursuant to NRS 463.370 in the immediately preceding fiscal year, as

determined by records maintained by the Board.

3. Each appointed member of the Committee serves for five successive terms of 1 year each. The initial term of a member begins from the date of the meeting during which the Commission made the appointment. Each of the successive terms renews automatically unless a member of the Commission requests that the matter be placed on the agenda for a meeting of the Commission for formal consideration, including, without limitation, the removal of the Committee member.

4. A vacancy on the Committee which occurs for any reason, including, without limitation, the removal of a member pursuant to subsection 3, must be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

Sec. 8. 1. The Commission shall:

(a) Grant to the Telecast Access Committee, whenever there exists an exclusive broadcast right, the exclusive right to negotiate with the cable operator or provider of direct broadcast satellite service an agreement for the telecast of a package of sporting events for which a sports pool in this State will accept wagers; and

(b) Require that any agreement negotiated pursuant to

paragraph (a):

(1) Provide for sports pools such fair and equitable rates as may be based upon reasonable and objective criteria; and

(2) Provide that the cable operator or provider of direct broadcast satellite service must offer to every person licensed to operate a sports pool pursuant to this chapter the same negotiated rates set forth in the agreement.

2. The Telecast Access Committee shall determine whether the telecast of a package of sporting events for which a sports pool will accept wagers is subject to the provisions of this section. Upon identifying such a package, the Committee shall notify the holder of the exclusive broadcast right and every sports pool licensed to operate in this State of the Committee's decision to exercise its exclusive right to negotiate an agreement with the applicable cable operator or provider of direct broadcast satellite service on behalf of sports pools pursuant to this section.





- 3. Any contract or amendment to a contract entered into between a holder of an exclusive broadcast right and a sports pool for a package of sporting events after the Committee has provided notice to either party pursuant to subsection 2 is void. Upon approval by the Board or its designee, an agreement entered into between the Committee and the holder of the exclusive broadcast right supersedes any contract entered into between the holder of the exclusive broadcast right and a sports pool for a package of sporting events.
- 4. Any agreement negotiated by the Committee pursuant to this section must be approved by the Board or its designee. In reviewing any such agreement, the Board shall ensure that the agreement is fair and equitable with respect to sports pools of varying sizes and does not create a barrier to competition among sports pools in this State.
  - 5. This section does not apply to:
  - (a) A telecast for off-track pari-mutuel wagering.
- (b) A closed circuit pay-per-view telecast of an individual event.
- (c) A package of sporting events that the Committee determines it has not identified sufficiently in advance of the scheduled telecast to allow for the negotiation of an agreement with the holder of the exclusive broadcast right pursuant to this section.
- (d) A package of sporting events that the Committee determines does not warrant the exercise of the Committee's rights under this section.
- 6. The Commission may adopt such regulations as it deems necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.
- **Sec. 9.** 1. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this act, the Nevada Gaming Commission shall appoint to the Sports Pool Telecast Access Committee the members required by section 7 of this act.
- 2. The Sports Pool Telecast Access Committee may exercise its authority pursuant to this act upon the effective date of this act regardless of whether the Nevada Gaming Commission has adopted regulations pursuant to section 8 of this act.
- Sec. 10. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
