SUMMARY—Makes an appropriation to the Mental Health Information System Account of the Division of Mental Health and Developmental Services of the Department of Health and Human Services for new software to implement the Department's technology policies. (BDR S-1181)

AN ACT making an appropriation to the Mental Health Information System Account of the Division of Mental Health and Developmental Services of the Department of Health and Human Services for new software to implement the Department's technology policies; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the State General
2 Fund to the Mental Health Information System Account of the
3 Division of Mental Health and Developmental Services of the
4 Department of Health and Human Services the sum of \$204,000 for
5 new software to implement the Department's technology policies.

6 **Sec. 2.** Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by
7 section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after
8 June 30, 2015, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or
9 any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or
10 otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the

1 appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose
2 after September 18, 2015, by either the entity to which the money
3 was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently
4 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General
5 Fund on or before September 18, 2015.

6 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
