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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.946 of the Revised Code to create the 2  
"Historical and Patriotic Education" license 3  
plate. 4

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 5  
4503.946 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 6

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 7  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 8  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 9  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 10  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 11  
in division (B) of this section. 12

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 13  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 14

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 15  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 16  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 17  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 18

cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 19  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 20  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 21  
other abortion-related activities. 22

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 23  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 24  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 25  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 26  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 27  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 28  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 29  
other money in that fund. 30

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 31  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 32  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 33  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 34

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 35  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 36  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 37  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 38  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 39  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 40  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 41  
directly to their clients. 42

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 43  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 44  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 45  
it receives under this section to assist those who have 46  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 77  
contributions into its general account to be used for 78  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 79  
America foundation. 80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 82  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 83  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 84  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 86  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 87  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 88  
scholarships and other educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 91  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 92  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 93  
that organization. 94

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 95  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 96  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 97  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 98  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 101  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 102  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 103  
programming. 104

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 105

pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 106  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 107  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 108  
need. 109

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 110  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 111  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 112  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 113

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 114  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 115  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 116  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 117  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 118  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 119  
scholarship fund. 120

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 121  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 122  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 123  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 124  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 125  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 126  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 127  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 128  
funds as provided in this section. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 131  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 132  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 133  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 134  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 135

program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 136  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 137  
funds as provided in this section. 138

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 139  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 140  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 141  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 142  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 143  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 144  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 145  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 146  
funds as provided in this section. 147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 148  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 149  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 150  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 151

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152  
receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 153  
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 154  
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 155  
advocates for addiction recovery). 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 158  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 159  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 160  
cyclists of all ages. 161

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 162  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 163  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 164

incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 165  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 166  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 167  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 170  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 171  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 172  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 174  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 175  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 176  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 177  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 179  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 180  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 181  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 182  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 183  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 184  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 185  
sponsors within this state. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 188  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 189  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 190  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 191  
activities. 192

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 193

receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 194  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 195  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 196  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 197  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 198

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 199  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 200  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 201  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 202  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 203  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 204  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 205  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 206  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 208  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 209  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 210  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 211  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 212  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 213  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215  
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 216  
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 217  
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 219  
receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 220  
nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 221  
health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 222  
further the nonprofit's mission. 223



The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and cats and for educational programs concerning the proper veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 254  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 255

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 256  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 257  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 258  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 259  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 260  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 261  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 262  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 263  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 264  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 265  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 266  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 267  
under this section. 268

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 269  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 270  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 271  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 272  
programs. 273

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 274  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 275  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 276  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 277

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 278  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 279  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 280  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 281  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 282

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use the contributions to further its mission of presenting and producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing arts education, and creating a superior destination for entertainment, business, and residential living.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and rehabilitation, and educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the

national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 342  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 343  
legends to inspire future leaders. 344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 346  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 347  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 348  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 349  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 350  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 352  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 353  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 354  
the contributions for educational purposes. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 357  
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 358  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 359

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 360  
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 361  
progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 362  
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 363  
center. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365  
receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 366  
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 367  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 369  
receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the 370

Ohio oil and gas energy education foundation to fund 371  
scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 372  
natural gas industry. 373

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 374  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 375  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 376  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 377  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 378  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 379  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 380  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 381

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 382  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 383  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 384  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 385  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 386  
(G) of that section. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 389  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 390  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 391  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 392  
Ohio and for educational programs. 393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 395  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 396  
supporting cancer research. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 399

Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 400

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 401  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 402  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 405  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 406  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 407  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 410  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 411  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 412  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 415  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 416  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 417  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 418  
scouts. 419

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 420  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 421  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 422  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 423  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 424

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 425  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 426  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 427  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation of Dayton.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the fees into its general account to be used for purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement methods, and teaching respect for law and order.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received



pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 458  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 459  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 460  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 461  
in the line of duty. 462

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 463  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 464  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 465  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 466  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 467

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 468  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 469  
association of chiefs of police. 470

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 471  
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 472  
Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 473  
cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 474  
memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 475  
families. 476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 477  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 478  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 479  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 481  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 482  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 483  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 484  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 485  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 486

administering a program to secure the proper representation in 487  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 488  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 489  
participating in that program. 490

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 491  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 492  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 493  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 494

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 495  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 496  
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 497  
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 498  
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 499

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 500  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 501  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 502  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 503  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 504  
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 505

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1028  
receives pursuant to section 4503.945 of the Revised Code to the 1029  
Summit metro parks foundation, which shall use the money in 1030  
support of the Summit county metro parks. 1031

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1032  
receives pursuant to section 4503.946 of the Revised Code to the 1033  
Ohio society, sons of the American revolution, which shall use 1034  
the contributions for special projects related to historical 1035  
education. 1036

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1037  
receives pursuant to section 4503.951 of the Revised Code to the 1038  
Cincinnati city school district. 1039

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1040  
receives pursuant to section 4503.952 of the Revised Code to 1041  
Hawken school located in northeast Ohio. The school shall use 1042  
fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide 1043  
tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the 1044  
remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in 1045  
providing services to the school's students that assist in 1046  
developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1047  
the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1048  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1049  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1050  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1051  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1052  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1053

use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1114  
in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1115  
developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1116  
the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1117

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1142  
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1143  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1144  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1145  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1146  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1147  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1148

the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1150  
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1151  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1152  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1153  
contributions for any political purpose. 1154

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1155  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1156  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1157  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1158  
any political purpose. 1159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1160  
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1161  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1162  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1163  
purpose. 1164

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1165  
receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to 1166  
Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use 1167  
contributions to fund college and career technical training 1168  
scholarships for students. 1169

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1170  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1171  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1172  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1173  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1175  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1176  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1177



activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1178  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1179

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1180  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1181  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1182  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1183  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1184  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1185  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1186  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1187

Sec. 4503.946. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1188  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1189  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1190  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1191  
and issuance of "Historical and Patriotic Education" license 1192  
plates. The application may be combined with a request for a 1193  
special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 1194  
of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application 1195  
and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of 1196  
this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1197  
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Historical and 1198  
Patriotic Education" license plates and a validation sticker, or 1199  
a validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1200  
the Revised Code. 1201

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1202  
inscribed on the license plates, "Historical and Patriotic 1203  
Education" license plates shall display an appropriate logo and 1204  
words selected by representatives of the Ohio society, sons of 1205  
the American revolution and that are approved by the registrar. 1206  
"Historical and Patriotic Education" license plates shall 1207

display county identification stickers that identify the county 1208  
of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 1209  
Code. 1210

(B) "Historical and Patriotic Education" license plates 1211  
and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be 1212  
issued upon receipt of an application for registration of a 1213  
motor vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license 1214  
tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1215  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1216  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1217  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1218  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1219  
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1220  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1221  
vehicles. 1222

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1223  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1224  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty 1225  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1226  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1227  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1228

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1229  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1230  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1231  
of "Historical and Patriotic Education" license plates, into the 1232  
state treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway 1233  
purposes fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1234

**Section 2.** That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1235  
Code is hereby repealed. 1236

**Section 3.** Section 4501.21 of the Revised Code is 1237  
presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended 1238  
by H.B. 74, H.B. 110, H.B. 281, H.B. 291, and H.B. 578, all of 1239  
the 134th General Assembly. The General Assembly, applying the 1240  
principle stated in division (B) of section 1.52 of the Revised 1241  
Code that amendments are to be harmonized if reasonably capable 1242  
of simultaneous operation, finds that the composite is the 1243  
resulting version of the section in effect prior to the 1244  
effective date of the section as presented in this act. 1245
