A BILL

To enact section 5.2299 of the Revised Code to 1
designate the second week of September as 2
"Krabbe Disease Awareness Week." 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5.2299 of the Revised Code be 4
enacted to read as follows: 5

Sec. 5.2299. The second week of September is designated as 6
"Krabbe Disease Awareness Week" to raise awareness of Krabbe 7
disease, also known as globoid cell leukodystrophy, which is a 8
life-threatening, inherited disorder that destroys the 9
protective coating of nerve cells in the brain and nervous 10
system, typically resulting in complications that include 11
seizures, muscle spasms, muscle deterioration, blindness, 12

deafness, and respiratory failure.

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
