**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.585 of the Revised Code to create the 2  
"Porsche Club" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.585 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10  
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18

quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20  
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28  
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40  
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 45  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47

receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 48  
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 49  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 50  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 52  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 53  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 54  
its research and other programs. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56  
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 60  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 61  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 62  
contributions for its research and other programs. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 65  
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 66  
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 67  
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70  
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72  
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76

contributions into its general account to be used for 77  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78  
America foundation. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87  
scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92  
that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 99  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 100  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 101  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 102  
programming. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 105

organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 106  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 107  
need. 108

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 109  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 110  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 111  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 112

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 113  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 114  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 115  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 116  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 117  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 118  
scholarship fund. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 121  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 122  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 123  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 124  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 125  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 126  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 127  
funds as provided in this section. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 130  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 131  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 132  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 133  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 134  
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 135

with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 136  
funds as provided in this section. 137

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 139  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 140  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 141  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 142  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 143  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 144  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 145  
funds as provided in this section. 146

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 148  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 149  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 152  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 153  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 154  
cyclists of all ages. 155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 157  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 158  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 159  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 160  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 161  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 164

fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 165  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 166  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 169  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 170  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 171  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 174  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 175  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 176  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 177  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 178  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 179  
sponsors within this state. 180

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 181  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 182  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 183  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 184  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 185  
activities. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 188  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 189  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 190  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 191  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 192

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 193

receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 194  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 195  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 196  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 197  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 198  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 199  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 200  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 201

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 202  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 203  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 204  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 205  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 206  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 207  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 208

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 209  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 210  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 211  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 212  
families. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 215  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 216  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 217  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 218  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 219  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 220  
destination. 221

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 222  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 223



to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 224  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 225  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 226

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 227  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 228  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 229  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 230  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 231  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 232  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 233  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 234  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 235  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 236  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 237

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 238  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 239  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 240

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 241  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 242  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 243  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 244  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 245  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 246  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 247  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 248  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 249  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 250  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 251  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 252  
under this section. 253

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the western reserve historical society, which shall use the contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the

registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which	284
such payments are to be made.	285
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	286
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the	287
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the	288
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning	289
river watershed.	290
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	291
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the	292
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen	293
nature preserve.	294
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	295
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the	296
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use	297
the money in support of the park.	298
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	299
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the	300
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the	301
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.	302
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	303
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the	304
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the	305
contributions to support the activities of the organization.	306
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	307
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the	308
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those	309
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational	310
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and	311
local beekeeping programs.	312

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities to take greater responsibility for improving the local environment through litter prevention, beautification, community greening, waste reduction, and recycling.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.585 of the Revised Code to the national porsche club organization, which shall use the contributions for educational seminars, porsche club of America juniors programs, promotion of diversity and inclusion in club activities and membership programs, support of club chapters in all fifty states, and support of national and regional events.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each

contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 342  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 343  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 344  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 345  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 346  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 347

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 348  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 349  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 350  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 351  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 352  
(G) of that section. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 354  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 355  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 356  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 357  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 358  
Ohio and for educational programs. 359

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 360  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 361  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 362  
supporting cancer research. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 365  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 366

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 367  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 368  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 370

receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 371  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 372  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 373  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 374

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 375  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 376  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 377  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 378  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 380  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 381  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 382  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 383  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 384  
scouts. 385

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 386  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 387  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 388  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 389  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 390

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 391  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 392  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 393  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 394

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 395  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 396  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 397  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 398

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 399

receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 400  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 401  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 402  
charitable purposes. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404  
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 405  
Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose. 406

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 407  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 408  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 409  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 410  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 411

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 412  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 413  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 414  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 415  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 416  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 417  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 418

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 419  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 420  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 421  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 422  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 423  
in the line of duty. 424

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 425  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 426  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 427  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 428

the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 429

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 430  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 431  
association of chiefs of police. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 434  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 435  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 436  
families. 437

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 439  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 440  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 443  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 444  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 445  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 446  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 447  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 448  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 449  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 450  
participating in that program. 451

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 452  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 453  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 454  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 455

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 456  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 457



Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 458  
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 459  
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 462  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 463  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 464  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 465  
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 466  
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 467  
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 468  
lives to the fullest. 469

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 470  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 471  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 472  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 473  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 474

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 475  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 476  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 477  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 478  
Cleveland, Ohio. 479

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 480  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 481  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 482  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 483  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 484  
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 485  
resides. 486

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting law enforcement education and assistance.

municipal corporation of Cleveland. The school shall use fifty 1020  
per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition 1021  
assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining 1022  
fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing 1023  
services to the school's students that assist in developing or 1024  
maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. 1025  
The services provided may include bereavement counseling, 1026  
instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity 1027  
training, and the counseling and education of students regarding 1028  
bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and 1029  
human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the 1030  
school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to 1031

receive training in providing those services. The school 1032  
principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate 1033  
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 1034  
that the school hires to provide those services. The school 1035  
shall ensure that any such charitable organization is exempt 1036  
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 1037  
Internal Revenue Code. The school shall not use the 1038  
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 1039

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1040  
receives pursuant to section 4503.955 of the Revised Code to 1041  
Saint Albert the Great school located in North Royalton. The 1042  
school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives 1043  
to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall 1044  
use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1045  
in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1046  
developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1047  
the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1048  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1049  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1050  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1051  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1052  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1053  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1054  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1055  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1056  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1057  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1058  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1059  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1060  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1061  
purpose. 1062

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the contributions for its gifted programs and special education and related services.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school shall not use the contributions it receives for any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit athletics at the school.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the contributions for any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1092  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1093  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1094  
purpose. 1095

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1096  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1097  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1098  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1099  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1100

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1101  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1102  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1103  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1104  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1105

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1106  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1107  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1108  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1109  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1110  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1111  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1112  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1113

Sec. 4503.585. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1114  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1115  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1116  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1117  
and issuance of "Porsche Club" license plates. The application 1118  
may be combined with a request for a special reserved license 1119  
plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon 1120  
receipt of the completed application and compliance by the 1121

applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the 1122  
registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 1123  
registration and a set of "Porsche Club" license plates and a 1124  
validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required 1125  
by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1126

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1127  
inscribed on the license plates, "Porsche Club" license plates 1128  
shall display an appropriate logo and words that are selected by 1129  
representatives of the Ohio chapters of Porsche club of America 1130  
and that are approved by the registrar. "Porsche Club" license 1131  
plates shall display county identification stickers that 1132  
identify the county of registration as required under section 1133  
4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1134

(B) "Porsche Club" license plates and a validation 1135  
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 1136  
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1137  
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1138  
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1139  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1140  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1141  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, and an 1142  
additional administrative fee of ten dollars; and compliance 1143  
with all other applicable laws relating to the registration of 1144  
motor vehicles. 1145

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 1146  
registration renewal the registrar receives under this section, 1147  
the registrar shall collect a contribution of ten dollars. The 1148  
registrar shall deposit this contribution into the state 1149  
treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution fund 1150  
created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1151

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1152  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1153  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1154  
of "Porsche Club" license plates, into the state treasury to the 1155  
credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created in 1156  
section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1157
