A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1
4503.755 of the Revised Code to create the 2
"Little Brown Jug" license plate. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4
4503.755 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 10
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 11
4503.50, 4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 12
4503.521, 4503.522, 4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 13

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 29
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 30

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 31
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 32
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 33
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 34
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 35
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 36
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 37
other abortion-related activities. 38

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 39
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 40
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 41
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 42
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 43
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 44
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 45
other money in that fund. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 47
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 48
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 49

and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 50

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 51
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 52
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 53
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 54
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 55
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 56
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 57
directly to their clients. 58

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 59
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 60
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 61
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 62
pancreatic cancer and their families. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 65
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 66
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 67
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 70
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 71
its research and other programs. 72

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 73
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 74
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 75
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 76

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 77
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 78

children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 79
contributions for its research and other programs. 80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 82
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 83
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 84
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 86
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 87
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 88
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 89
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 92
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 93
contributions into its general account to be used for 94
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 95
America foundation. 96

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 97
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 98
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 99
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 100
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 102
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 103
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 104
scholarships and other educational activities. 105

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 106
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 107

organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 108
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 109
that organization. 110

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 111
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 112
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 113
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 114
section. A university or college that receives contributions 115
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 116
scholarship fund. 117

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 118
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 119
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 120
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 121
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 122
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 123
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 124
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 125
funds as provided in this section. 126

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 127
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 128
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 129
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 130
cyclists of all ages. 131

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 132
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 133
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 134
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 135
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 136
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 137

educational, and cultural events at the monument. 138

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 139
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 140
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 141
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 142
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 143

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 144
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 145
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 146
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 147
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 148

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 149
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 150
United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 151
four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 152
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 153
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 154
sponsors within this state. 155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 157
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 158
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 159
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 160
activities. 161

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 162
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 163
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 164
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 165
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 166

to children, young adults, and families in this state. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 169
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 170
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 171
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 172
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 173
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 174
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 175
the improvement of patient outcomes. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 177
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 178
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 179
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 180
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 181
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 182
personnel, veterans, and their families. 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 185
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 186
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 187
families. 188

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 189
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 190
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 191
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 192
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 193
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 194
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 195
destination. 196

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 197
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 198
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 199
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 200
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 201

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 202
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 203
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 204
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 205
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 206
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 207
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 208
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 209
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 210
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 211
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 212

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 213
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 214
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 215

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 216
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 217
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 218
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 219
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 220
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 221
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 222
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 223
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 224
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 225
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 226

incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 227
under this section. 228

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 229
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 230
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 231
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 232
programs. 233

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 234
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 235
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 236
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 237

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 238
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 239
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 240
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 241
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 242

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 243
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 244
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 245
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 246
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 247
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 248
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 249
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 250
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 251
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 252
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 253
such payments are to be made. 254

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255

receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 256
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 257
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 258
river watershed. 259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 260
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to 261
Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute 262
to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 264
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 265
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 266
the money in support of the park. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 268
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 269
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 270
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 272
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 273
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 274
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 275

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 276
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 277
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 278
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 279
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 280
local beekeeping programs. 281

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 282
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 283
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 284

contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 285
legends to inspire future leaders. 286

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 287
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 288
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 289
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 290
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 291
commission and that is participating in the license plate 292
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 293
of the county of residence of an applicant. 294

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 295
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 296
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 297
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 298
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 299
(G) of that section. 300

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 301
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 302
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 303
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 304
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 305
Ohio and for educational programs. 306

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 307
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 308
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 309
supporting cancer research. 310

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 311
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 312
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 313

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 314
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 315
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 316
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 317
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 318

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 319
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 320
great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 321
America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 322
equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 323
the girl scouts. 324

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 325
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 326
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 327
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 328
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 330
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 331
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 332
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 335
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 336
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 337
charitable purposes. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 339
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 340
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 341
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 342

purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 343

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 345
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 346
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 347
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 348
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 349
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 350

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 351
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 352
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 353
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 354
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 355
in the line of duty. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 357
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 358
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 359
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 360
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 362
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 363
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 364
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 365
families. 366

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 367
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 368
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 369
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 370
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 371

shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 372
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 373
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 374
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 375
participating in that program. 376

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 377
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 378
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 379
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 380

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 381
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 382
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 383
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 384
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 385

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 386
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 387
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 388
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 389
Cleveland, Ohio. 390

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 391
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 392
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 393
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 394
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 395
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 396
resides. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 399
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 400

contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 401
law enforcement education and assistance. 402

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 403
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 404
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 405
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 406
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 407
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 410
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 411
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 412
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 413
rotary foundation. 414

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 415
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 416
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 417
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 418
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 419

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 420
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 421
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 422
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 423

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 424
receives pursuant to section 4503.755 of the Revised Code to the 425
little brown jug society to assist the society in maintaining, 426
promulgating, and operating the little brown jug as part of 427
Ohio's rich harness racing history. 428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 429

receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 430
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 431
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 432
connection. 433

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 434
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 435
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 436
contributions to distribute between the various historical 437
societies and museums in Medina county. 438

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 439
receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the 440
Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the 441
contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and 442
scholarship purposes. 443

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444
receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 445
Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 446
research projects. 447

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 448
receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 449
Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 450
contributions solely to promote and support the historical 451
preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 452
state. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454
receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 455
Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 456
contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 457
baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the Solon city school district. The school district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations that the school district hires to provide those services. The school district also may use the contributions it receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive training in providing such services to the students of the school district. The school district shall ensure that any charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the contributions it receives for any other purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.872 of the Revised Code to the Canton city school district. The district may use the contributions for student welfare, but shall not use the contributions for any political purpose or to pay salaries of district employees.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to

Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal 490
corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 491
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 492
students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 493
pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 494

Not later than the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this section the investment income the fund earned the previous calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity received from the fund during the previous calendar year.

Sec. 4503.755. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle and issuance of "Little Brown Jug" license plates. The application may be combined with a request for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Little Brown Jug" license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code.

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily inscribed on the license plates, "Little Brown Jug" license plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are selected by representatives of the little brown jug society and

approved by the registrar. "Little Brown Jug" license plates 947
shall display county identification stickers that identify the 948
county of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the 949
Revised Code. 950

(B) "Little Brown Jug" license plates and a validation 951
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 952
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 953
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 954
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 955
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 956
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 957
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 958
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 959
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 960
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 961

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 963
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 964
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty 965

state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 967
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 968

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 969
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 970
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 971
of "Little Brown Jug" license plates, into the state treasury to 972
the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created 973
in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 974
