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**A BILL**

To amend sections 4501.21 and 4503.772 and to enact 1  
sections 5.036, 5.074, 5.2315, 5.243, 5.244, 2  
5.245, 5.2512, 5.2571, 5.262, 5.263, 5.264, 3  
5.481, 5.49, 5.50, 4503.567, 4503.595, 4503.723, 4  
4503.734, 4503.765, 4503.872, 4503.909, 5  
4503.941, 4503.952, 4503.953, 4503.954, 6  
4503.955, 5534.152, 5534.39, 5534.403, 5534.404, 7  
5534.481, 5534.492, 5534.493, 5534.77, 5534.805, 8  
5534.806, 5534.808, 5534.81, 5534.82, 5534.83, 9  
5534.85, 5534.891, 5534.892, 5534.96, and 10  
5534.98 of the Revised Code to designate 11  
multiple memorial highways and bridges, to 12  
create multiple nonstandard license plates, to 13  
create multiple special designations, and to 14  
designate John Glenn's childhood home as a state 15  
historic site. 16

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That sections 4501.21 and 4503.772 be amended 17

5534.39, 5534.403, 5534.404, 5534.481, 5534.492, 5534.493, 22  
5534.77, 5534.805, 5534.806, 5534.808, 5534.81, 5534.82, 23  
5534.83, 5534.85, 5534.891, 5534.892, 5534.96, and 5534.98 of 24  
the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 25

**Sec. 5.036.** A shelter pet is hereby designated as the 26  
official pet of the state to raise public awareness of shelter 27  
animals. 28

**Sec. 5.074.** The barn, an agricultural building located on 29  
farms and used for many purposes, is hereby designated the 30  
official historical architectural structure of the state. 31

**Sec. 5.2315.** The month of October shall be designated as 32  
"Ohio Principals Month" to honor the service of all elementary, 33  
middle, and high school principals and to recognize the 34  
importance of school leadership in ensuring that every child has 35  
access to a high-quality education. 36

**Sec. 5.243.** The sixteenth day of July is designated as 37  
"National Atomic Veterans Day" in this state to raise awareness 38  
of the health issues many atomic veterans suffer as a result of 39  
their service and sacrifice. 40

**Sec. 5.244.** The month of June is designated as 41  
"Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month." 42

**Sec. 5.245.** The second week of October is designated as 43  
"Ohio Covered Bridge Week." 44

**Sec. 5.2512.** The thirtieth day of January is designated as 45

"Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy Awareness Day" to raise public awareness about chronic traumatic encephalopathy and those affected by it. 46  
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**Sec. 5.2571.** The sixth day of October is designated as "S.M.A.R.T. Parent Day," to remind parents to have conversations with their children about Social Media Awareness, Respect, and Timing. 49  
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**Sec. 5.262.** The twelfth day of September is designated "Jesse Owens Day," in honor of Jesse Owens, a track and field champion and national hero, who was born on that day in 1913. Known affectionately as the Buckeye Bullet, Jesse Owens, representing The Ohio State University, set three world records in the 220-yard dash, the 220-yard low hurdles, and the long jump at the Big Ten track and field finals on May 25, 1935, and, representing the United States at the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin, Germany, won four gold medals, one each in the 100-meter dash, the 200-meter dash, the long jump, and the 4 x 100-meter relay. 53  
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**Sec. 5.263.** The month of September is designated "We Card Month" to encourage retailers to ask for identification from each person who attempts to purchase age-restricted products in order to prevent sales of those products to minors. 64  
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**Sec. 5.264.** The month of April is designated as "Sarcoidosis Awareness Month." 68  
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**Sec. 5.481.** The first Saturday of May is designated as "Veterans Suicide Awareness Day." 70  
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**Sec. 5.49.** The twelfth day of June is designated as "Superman Day" to recognize the Ohio birthplace of one of the creators of the superhero who stood for "truth, justice, and the 72  
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American way." For on this day, let it be known that Superman is 75  
faster than a speeding bullet, more powerful than a locomotive, 76  
able to leap tall buildings in a single bound. Look! Up in the 77  
sky! It's a bird. It's a plane. It's Superman! 78

**Sec. 5.50.** The twenty-fifth day of May is designated as 79  
"Ohio National Missing Children's Day." 80

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 81  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 82  
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 83  
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 84  
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 85  
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 86  
4503.50, 4503.501, 4503.502, 4503.505, 4503.51, 4503.514, 87  
4503.521, 4503.522, 4503.523, 4503.524, 4503.525, 4503.526, 88  
4503.528, 4503.529, 4503.531, 4503.534, 4503.545, 4503.55, 89

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 104

registrar collects in the fund as follows: 105

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 106  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 107  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 108  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 109  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 110  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 111  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 112  
other abortion-related activities. 113

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 114  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 115  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 116  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 117  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 118  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 119  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 120  
other money in that fund. 121

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 122  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 123  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 124  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 125

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 126  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 127  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 128  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 129  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 130  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 131  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 132  
directly to their clients. 133

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to

the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 163  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 164  
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 167  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 168  
contributions into its general account to be used for 169  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 170  
America foundation. 171

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 172  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 173  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 174  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 175  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 177  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 178  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 179  
scholarships and other educational activities. 180

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 181  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 182  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 183  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 184  
that organization. 185

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 186  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 187  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 188  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 189  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 190  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 191

scholarship fund. 192

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 193  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 194  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 195  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 196  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 197  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 198  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 199  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 200  
funds as provided in this section. 201

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 202  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 203  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 204  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 205  
cyclists of all ages. 206

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 207  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 208  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 209  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 210  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 211  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 212  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 215  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 216  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 217  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 219  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 220



Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 221  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 222  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 223

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 224  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 225  
United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 226  
four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 227  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 228  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 229  
sponsors within this state. 230

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 231  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 232  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 233  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 234  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 235  
activities. 236

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 237  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 238  
Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the 239  
money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it 240  
incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the 241  
provision of services to children, young adults, and families in 242  
this state. 243

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 244  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 245  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 246  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 247  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 248  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 249  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 250

research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 251  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 252

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 253  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 254  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 255  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 256  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 257  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 258  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 260  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 261  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 262  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 263  
families. 264

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 265  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 266  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 267  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 268  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 269  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 270  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 271  
destination. 272

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 273  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 274  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 275  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 276  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 277

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 278  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 279

4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 280  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 281  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 282  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 283  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 284  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 285  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 286  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 287  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 288

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 289  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 290  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 291

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 292  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 293  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 294  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 295  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 296  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 297  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 298  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 299  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 300  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 301  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 302  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 303  
under this section. 304

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 305  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 306  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 307  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 308  
programs. 309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the western reserve historical society, which shall use the contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each contribution the registrar receives under that section that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate

program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 369  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 370

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 371  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 372  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 373  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 374  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 375  
(G) of that section. 376

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 377  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 378  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 379  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 380  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 381  
Ohio and for educational programs. 382

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 383  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 384  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 385  
supporting cancer research. 386

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 387  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 388  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 390  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 391  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 392  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 393  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 394

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 395  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 396  
great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 397

America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 398  
equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 399  
the girl scouts. 400

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 401  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 402  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 403  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 404  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 405

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 406  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 407  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 408  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 411  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 412  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 413  
charitable purposes. 414

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 415  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 416  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 417  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 418  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 419

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 420  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 421  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 422  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 423  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 424  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 425  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 426

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 427  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 428  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 429  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 430  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 431  
in the line of duty. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 433  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 434  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 435  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 436  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 437

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 439  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 440  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 441  
families. 442

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 443  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 444  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 445  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 446  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 447  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 448  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 449  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 450  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 451  
participating in that program. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 454  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 455  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 456



The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for purposes of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.
