7 PROPOSED SUBCOMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

8 An Act relating to teachers; amending 70 O.S. 2021,
9 Sections 6-204.2 and 6-204.3, which relate to the
10 Education Leadership Oklahoma Act; updating
11 Commission name; modifying purposes of the Education
12 Leadership Oklahoma program; providing financial
13 assistance for teachers renewing their National Board
14 certification; limiting applicants for renewal
15 program; setting maximum award for each applicant;
16 providing annual bonus for teachers with National
17 Board certification; modifying term of years for the
18 bonus; prohibiting inclusion of bonus in calculating
19 salary; removing reference to additional salary
20 increment; modifying verification process for
21 eligible teachers; updating name of Commission with
22 oversight of Fund; modifying authorized expenditures;
23 amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 18-114.14, which
24 relates to the Minimum Salary Schedule; modifying
effective date of schedule; deleting salary increment
for certain teachers; providing an effective date;
and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-204.2, is
amended to read as follows:

1 Section 6-204.2 A. The ~~Oklahoma~~ Commission for ~~Teacher~~
2 ~~Preparation~~ Educational Quality and Accountability and the State
3 Board of Education are authorized to establish the Education
4 Leadership Oklahoma program.

5 B. The purposes of the Education Leadership Oklahoma program
6 are to:

7 1. Provide teachers throughout the state information about
8 National Board certification and the Education Leadership Oklahoma
9 program services;

10 2. Provide technical assistance and National-Board-certified
11 mentors to all teachers seeking National Board certification upon
12 request;

13 3. Reward teachers who are seeking National Board certification
14 by awarding them a portion of the application processing charge and
15 assessment fee and a scholarship as provided in subsection D of this
16 section;

17 4. Reward teachers who are renewing their National Board
18 certification by awarding them a portion of the renewal application
19 fee as provided in subsection E of this subsection; and

20 ~~4.~~ 5. Provide recognition to National-Board-certified teachers.

21 C. To fulfill the objectives of the Education Leadership
22 Oklahoma Act, the ~~Oklahoma~~ Commission for ~~Teacher Preparation~~
23 Educational Quality and Accountability shall:
24

1 1. Inform teachers of the Education Leadership Oklahoma program
2 and services it provides to teachers seeking National Board
3 certification, emphasizing recruiting efforts toward teachers at
4 high-poverty schools, schools identified as in need of improvement
5 and in counties with the lowest percentage of teachers who have
6 achieved National Board certification; and

7 2. Ensure that all teachers seeking National Board
8 certification receive adequate information regarding the level of
9 commitment required to acquire National Board certification.

10 D. The Commission shall select not more than one hundred (100)
11 applicants to participate in the program each fiscal year for whom
12 the Commission shall pay one-half (1/2) of the application
13 processing charge and assessment fee for National Board
14 certification. The total amount paid by the Commission shall not
15 exceed One Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$1,300.00) per applicant.
16 In addition the Commission shall also provide to the selected
17 applicants a scholarship in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars
18 (\$500.00) to cover other expenses associated with obtaining National
19 Board certification.

20 E. The OEQA shall select not more than three hundred (300)
21 applicants to participate in the renewal program each fiscal year
22 for whom the OEQA shall pay a portion of the fee for National Board
23 certification renewal. The total amount paid by the OEQA shall not
24 exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) per applicant.

1 ~~E.~~ F. The Commission shall promulgate rules establishing a
2 process for accepting applications for the Education Leadership
3 Oklahoma program and for providing to applicants selected for the
4 program up-front payment of the application processing charge and
5 assessment fee and scholarship. If a selected applicant who
6 receives the up-front payment does not complete National Board
7 certification within three (3) years, the applicant shall repay the
8 Commission the full amount paid by the Commission pursuant to
9 subsection D of this section. All selected applicants who do not
10 receive an up-front payment and successfully complete National Board
11 certification shall be reimbursed by the Commission for the
12 application processing charge and assessment fee. The total amount
13 of reimbursement paid by the Commission shall not exceed One
14 Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$1,300.00) per applicant.

15 ~~F.~~ G. It is the intent of the Legislature that the ~~Oklahoma~~
16 Commission for ~~Teacher Preparation~~ Educational Quality and
17 Accountability contract with Southeastern Oklahoma State University
18 to establish Education Leadership Oklahoma program training in
19 higher education teacher preparation programs in the state to assist
20 teachers in meeting the requirements to obtain National Board
21 certification.

22 ~~G.~~ H. All teachers seeking National Board certification shall
23 be eligible to participate in Education Leadership Oklahoma program
24

1 training to assist them in meeting the requirements of the National
2 Board certification process, free of charge.

3 ~~H.~~ I. Subject to district board of education policy or
4 collective bargaining agreement, additional professional leave days
5 may be granted to teachers seeking National Board certification for
6 National Board certification portfolio development. During the two
7 (2) days of the additional professional days granted to teachers for
8 National Board certification portfolio development, a substitute
9 teacher shall be provided by the school district at no cost to the
10 teacher.

11 ~~I.~~ J. 1. The State Board of Education shall provide to
12 teachers who attained National Board certification prior to June 30,
13 2013, a bonus in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00)
14 annually over a ten-year period, to be paid no later than January 31
15 each year. The Beginning July 1, 2023, the Board shall provide a
16 bonus in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) annually
17 over a five-year period, to be paid not later than January 31 each
18 year to any teacher who:

19 a. attains National Board certification after ~~June 30,~~
20 ~~2013, if the teacher was selected for the Education~~
21 ~~Leadership Oklahoma program before June 30, 2013, or~~
22 ~~the teacher has submitted an application for National~~
23 ~~Board certification to the National Board for~~

24

1 ~~Professional Teaching Standards before June 30, 2013~~
2 July 1, 2023, or

3 b. attained National Board certification before July 1,
4 2023, and was receiving an additional salary increment
5 pursuant to the Minimum Salary Schedule in Section 18-
6 114.14 of this title, for the remaining time of the
7 ten-year period.

8 2. The teachers eligible to receive the annual bonus as
9 provided for in paragraph 1 of this subsection shall receive the
10 annual bonus for the ~~ten-year~~ five-year duration of their National
11 Board certification or for the remaining duration of their National
12 Board certification if they attained National Board certification
13 before July 1, 2023, and have less than ten (10) years remaining in
14 their certification and so long as they are teaching in the
15 classroom full-time in an Oklahoma public school. No school or
16 school district shall be liable for payment of bonuses pursuant to
17 this section.

18 3. The bonus shall not be included in the calculation of the
19 teacher's salary for purposes of meeting the district or statutory
20 ~~minimum salary schedule~~ Minimum Salary Schedule, including instances
21 where the salary schedule of the district exceeds the statutory
22 Minimum Salary Schedule, or for purposes of compensating Oklahoma
23 Teachers' Retirement System contributions or benefits.

1 4. ~~Teachers eligible to receive the annual bonus as provided~~
2 ~~for in paragraph 1 of this subsection shall not be eligible to~~
3 ~~receive the additional salary increment for National Board~~
4 ~~certification as set forth in the minimum salary schedule in Section~~
5 ~~3 of this act.~~

6 5. ~~Teachers who attain National Board certification after June~~
7 ~~30, 2013, shall be eligible to receive the additional salary~~
8 ~~increments for National Board certification as set forth in the~~
9 ~~minimum salary schedule in Section 3 of this act.~~

10 ~~6.~~ The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules for a
11 process by which a National-Board-certified teacher will verify
12 that:

- 13 a. the National Board certification has not lapsed,
- 14 b. the teacher is still a full-time teacher, and
- 15 c. for teachers eligible for the bonus, the teacher has
16 not exceeded the limit of annual bonus payments as
17 provided for in paragraph 1 of this subsection.

18 ~~J.~~ K. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Oklahoma
19 State Regents for Higher Education incorporate the National Board
20 certification portfolio development into all programs in education
21 leading to a master's level degree.

22 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-204.3, is
23 amended to read as follows:

24

1 Section 6-204.3 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
2 revolving fund for the ~~Oklahoma~~ Commission for ~~Teacher Preparation~~
3 Educational Quality and Accountability to be designated the
4 "Education Leadership Oklahoma Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a
5 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall
6 consist of all monies appropriated or transferred to the fund by the
7 Legislature. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are
8 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the ~~Oklahoma~~
9 ~~Commission for Teacher Preparation~~ to provide assistance and
10 scholarships for candidates seeking National Board certification and
11 renewal and to provide annual bonuses to qualified teachers pursuant
12 to the requirements of Section 6-204.2 of this title. Expenditures
13 from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State
14 Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the
15 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for
16 approval and payment

17 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 18-114.14,
18 is amended to read as follows:

19 Section 18-114.14 A. Beginning with the ~~2018-2019~~ 2023-2024
20 school year, certified personnel, as defined in Section 26-103 of
21 this title, in the public schools of Oklahoma shall receive in
22 salary and/or fringe benefits not less than the amounts specified in
23 the following schedule:

11 B. 1. When determining the Minimum Salary Schedule, "fringe
12 benefits" shall mean all or part of retirement benefits, excluding
13 the contributions made pursuant to subsection A of Section 17-108.1
14 of this title and the flexible benefit allowance pursuant to Section
15 26-105 of this title from the flexible benefit allowance funds
16 disbursed by the State Board of Education and the State Board of
17 Career and Technology Education pursuant to Section 26-104 of this
18 title.

19 2. If a school district intends to provide retirement benefits
20 to a teacher such that the teacher's salary would be less than the
21 amounts set forth in the ~~minimum salary schedule~~ Minimum Salary
22 Schedule specified in subsection A of this section, the district
23 shall be required to provide written notification to the teacher
24 prior to his or her employment or, if already employed by the

1 district, no later than thirty (30) days prior to the date the
2 district elects to provide retirement benefits such that the
3 teacher's salary would be less than the ~~minimum salary schedule~~
4 Minimum Salary Schedule.

5 C. Any of the degrees referred to in this section shall be from
6 a college recognized by the State Board of Education. The Board
7 shall accept teaching experience from out-of-state school districts
8 that are accredited by the state board of education or appropriate
9 state accrediting agency for the districts. The Board shall accept
10 teaching experience from out-of-country schools that are accredited
11 or otherwise endorsed by the appropriate national or regional
12 accrediting or endorsement authority. Out-of-country certification
13 documentation in a language other than English shall be analyzed by
14 an educational credential evaluation service in accordance with
15 industry standards and guidelines and approved by the State
16 Department of Education. The person seeking to have credit granted
17 for out-of-country teaching experience shall be responsible for all
18 costs of the analysis by a credential evaluation service. The Board
19 shall accept teaching experience from primary and secondary schools
20 that are operated by the United States Department of Defense or are
21 affiliated with the United States Department of State.

22 D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement,
23 no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of
24 active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-of-

1 country teaching experience as a certified teacher or its
2 equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of
3 education from crediting more years of experience on district salary
4 schedules than those allowed for state purposes.

5 E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes
6 of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience
7 of a:

8 1. Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of
9 the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;

10 2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of
11 Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher
12 by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational
13 Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and
14 Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma
15 Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;

16 3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor which were completed
17 while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor
18 was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a
19 teacher in Oklahoma;

20 4. Certified teacher which were completed while employed by the
21 Child Study Center located at University Hospital, if the teacher
22 was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma; and

23 5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist which were
24 completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological

1 assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma
2 if the experience primarily involved work with persons of school- or
3 preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the experience was
4 acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification as, a school
5 psychologist or psychometrist.

6 F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers
7 who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school
8 in Oklahoma and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit.

9 G. If a person employed as certified personnel, as defined in
10 Section 26-103 of this title, by a school district during the 2017-
11 2018 school year was receiving a salary above the step level
12 indicated by the ~~State~~ state Minimum Salary Schedule for the 2017-
13 2018 school year, the person shall receive a salary increase amount
14 equal to the amount indicated in subsection A of this section for
15 the step level indicated for the person, provided they remain
16 employed by the same district, unless the hours or the duties of the
17 certified personnel are reduced proportionately.

18 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

19 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
20 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
21 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
22 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
