1"SECTION 4.AMENDATORY21 O.S. 2021, Section 1550.42, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 1550.42. A. The following entities may create, publish or otherwise manufacture an identification document, identification card, or identification certificate and may possess an engraved plate or other such device for the printing of such identification; provided, the name of the issuing entity shall be clearly printed upon the face of the identification:

9 1. Businesses, companies, corporations, service organizations 10 and federal, state and local governmental agencies for employee 11 identification which is designed to identify the bearer as an 12 employee;

Businesses, companies, corporations and service
 organizations for customer identification which is designed to
 identify the bearer as a customer or member;

3. Federal, state and local government agencies for purposes authorized or required by law or any legitimate purpose consistent with the duties of such an agency, including, but not limited to, voter identification cards, driver licenses, nondriver identification cards, passports, birth certificates and social security cards;

4. Any public school or state or private educational
institution, as defined by Sections 1-106, 21-101 or 3102 of Title

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70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to identify the bearer as an 1 administrator, faculty member, student or employee; 2 5. Any professional organization or labor union to identify the 3 bearer as a member of the professional organization or labor union; 4 5 and 6. Businesses, companies or corporations which manufacture 6 medical-alert identification for the wearer thereof. 7 B. All identification documents as provided for in paragraph 3 8 9 or 4 of subsection A of this section shall be issued only to United 10 States citizens, nationals and legal permanent resident aliens. 19	registration services as required by the National Voter Registration
20	Act. The person shall be asked whether he or she wishes to register
21	to vote or to change his or her address for voting purposes. A
22	person who declines to register shall confirm such choice in writing
23	or by electronic means. Completed electronic voter registration
24	applications shall be electronically transmitted by the agency

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1 accepting the application to the State Election Board or county 2 election board. Completed paper voter registration applications shall be transmitted by the agency accepting the application at the 3 close of business each week to the State Election Board in 4 5 preaddressed, postage prepaid envelopes provided by the State Election Board. If a person registers or declines to register to 6 vote, the office at which the person submits the voter registration 7 application or the fact that the person declined to register shall 8 9 remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration 10 purposes.

No voter registration services shall be offered to any 11 в. 12 person who, at the time of an application for issuance or renewal of an Oklahoma driver license or state identification card, provides 13 documentation that shows that the person is not a citizen of the 14 United States. Any applicant or licensee providing an individual 15 tax identification number to Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator 16 pursuant to Section 6-106 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall 17 not be provided voter registration services as the applicant or 18 licensee is not a qualified elector pursuant to this section. 19

20 C. A change of address for an Oklahoma driver license or state 21 identification card submitted by a registered voter shall also serve 22 as a change of address for voter registration purposes if the new 23 address is within the same county where the voter is registered to 24 vote. If the new address is outside the county where the voter is

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currently registered to vote, the voter shall be sent a notice and application with instructions for registering to vote at the new address. A change of address for an Oklahoma driver license or state identification card shall not be used to update a voter registration address if the registrant states in writing or by electronic means that the change of address is not for voter registration purposes.

D. Licensed operators shall receive fifty cents (\$0.50) per
valid paper voter registration application or application for change
in voter registration taken by themselves and employees of the
licensed operator's office taken at the licensed operator's office,
payable by the State Election Board.

E. Service Oklahoma shall notify the Secretary of the State Election Board of licensed operator appointments. Service Oklahoma shall notify the Secretary of the State Election Board of licensed operators qualified to issue driver licenses.

F. <u>1. At least weekly, Service Oklahoma shall electronically</u> <u>transmit to the Secretary of the State Election Board a complete</u> <u>list of identifying information that shall include the name, date of</u> <u>birth, residential address, mailing address, and driver license</u> <u>number of all applicants or licensees who have provided an</u> <u>individual tax identification number pursuant to Section 6-106 of</u> <u>Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.</u>

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1 2. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall compare the 2 transmitted identifying information provided pursuant to paragraph 1 of this subsection with the list of registered voters in each 3 4 county. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall notify the 5 secretary of any relevant county election board of any matches based on the identifying information provided by Service Oklahoma. 6 3. Upon receipt of notification from the Secretary of the State 7 8 Election Board pursuant to paragraph 2 of this subsection, the 9 secretary of the county election board shall notify the proper 10 authority pursuant to Section 16-123 of this title to investigate whether a violation related to voting crimes or voter registration 11 12 has occurred, and any unlawful voter registration shall be automatically canceled. 13 4. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall not retain 14 the information provided pursuant to paragraph 1 of this subsection 15 after the completion of his or her duties pursuant to paragraph 2 of 16 17 this subsection except as may be necessary when assisting with an 18 investigation. No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be licensed to operate any motor vehicle which is required to be 6 placarded for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, 7 subpart F, except as provided in subsection F of this section; 8 9 provided, a person eighteen (18) years of age or older may be licensed to operate a farm vehicle which is required to be placarded 10 for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, subpart F, 11 12 except as provided in subsection F of this section. 13 5. A person at least seventeen (17) years of age who successfully completes all examinations required by law may be 14 issued by Service Oklahoma: 15 a restricted Class A commercial license which shall 16 а. grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class 17 A or Class B commercial motor vehicle for harvest 18 purposes or a Class D motor vehicle, or 19 a restricted Class B commercial license which shall b. 20 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class 21 B commercial motor vehicle for harvest purposes or a 22 Class D motor vehicle. 23

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6. No person shall operate a Class D motor vehicle unless the
 person is sixteen (16) years of age or older and holds a valid Class
 D license, except as provided for in Section 6-102 or 6-105 of this
 title. Any person holding a valid Class D license shall be
 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Class D only.

C. Any person issued a driver license pursuant to this section
may exercise the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and
highways in this state.

9 D. No person shall operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle without having a valid Class A, B, C or D license with a motorcycle 10 endorsement. Except as otherwise provided by law, any new applicant 11 12 for an original driver license shall be required to successfully 13 complete a written examination, vision examination and driving examination for a motorcycle as prescribed by the Department of 14 Public Safety, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, and a certified 15 state-approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the 16 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, if the applicant 17 is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to be eligible for a 18 motorcycle endorsement thereon. The written examination and driving 19 examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service Oklahoma 20 upon verification that the person has successfully completed a 21 certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course approved by the 22 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma. 23

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1 E. Except as otherwise provided by law, any person who lawfully possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license which is eligible for 2 renewal shall be required to successfully complete a written 3 examination, vision examination and driving examination for a 4 5 motorcycle as prescribed by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, and a certified state-approved motorcycle basic 6 rider course approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service 7 Oklahoma, if the person is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to 8 9 be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement. The written examination and driving examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service 10 Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully 11 12 completed a certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course 13 approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma. 1. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older may apply F. 14 for a restricted Class A, B or C commercial learner permit. 15 Service Oklahoma, after the applicant has passed all parts of the 16 17 examination for a Class D license and has successfully passed all parts of the examination for a Class A, B or C commercial license 18 other than the driving examination, may issue to the applicant a 19 commercial learner permit which shall entitle the person having 20 immediate lawful possession of the commercial learner permit and a 21 valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional driver license pursuant 22 to Section 6-212 of this title to operate a Class A, B or C 23 commercial motor vehicle upon the public highways solely for the 24

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purpose of behind-the-wheel training in accordance with rules
 promulgated by the Department.

This commercial learner permit shall be issued for a period 3 2. as provided in Section 6-115 of this title of one hundred eighty 4 5 (180) days, which may be renewed one time for an additional one hundred eighty (180) days; provided, such commercial learner permit 6 may be suspended, revoked, canceled, denied or disqualified at the 7 discretion of the Department, with notice to Service Oklahoma, for 8 9 violation of the restrictions, for failing to give the required or correct information on the application or for violation of any 10 traffic laws of this state pertaining to the operation of a motor 11 12 vehicle. Except as otherwise provided, the lawful possessor of a 13 commercial learner permit who has been issued a commercial learner permit for a minimum of fourteen (14) days may have the restriction 14 requiring an accompanying driver removed by satisfactorily 15 completing a driver's examination; provided, the removal of a 16 restriction shall not authorize the operation of a Class A, B or C 17 commercial motor vehicle if such operation is otherwise prohibited 18 by law. 19

3. No person shall apply for and Service Oklahoma shall not
issue an original Class A, B or C driver license until the person
has been issued a commercial learner permit and held the permit for
at least fourteen (14) days. Any person who currently holds a Class
B or C license and who wishes to apply for another class of

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1 commercial driver license shall be required to apply for a 2 commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at least fourteen (14) days before applying for the Class A or B license, as 3 applicable. Any person who currently holds a Class A, B or C 4 5 license and who wishes to add an endorsement or remove a restriction for which a skills examination is required shall be required to 6 apply for a commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at 7 least fourteen (14) days before applying for the endorsement. 8

9 4. A commercial learner permit shall be issued by Service 10 Oklahoma as a separate and unique document which shall be valid only 11 in conjunction with a valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional 12 driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title, both of 13 which shall be in the possession of the person to whom they have 14 been issued whenever that person is operating a commercial motor 15 vehicle as provided in this subsection.

5. After one renewal of a commercial learner permit, as 16 provided in paragraph 2 of this subsection, a commercial permit 17 shall not be renewed again. Any person who has held a commercial 18 learner permit for the initial issuance period and one renewal 19 period shall not be eliqible for and Service Oklahoma shall not 20 issue another renewal of the permit; provided, the person may 21 reapply for a new commercial learner permit, as provided for in this 22 subsection. 23

G. 1. For purposes of this title:

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1 "REAL ID Compliant Driver License" or "Identification a. Card" means a driver license or identification card 2 issued by this state that has been certified by the 3 United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) 4 5 as compliant with the requirements of the REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law No. 109-13. A REAL ID Compliant 6 Driver License or Identification Card and the process 7 through which it is issued incorporate a variety of 8 9 security measures designed to protect the integrity and trustworthiness of the license or card. A REAL ID 10 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card will 11 12 be clearly marked on the face indicating that it is a 13 compliant document, and

b. "REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License" or 14 "Identification Card" means a driver license or 15 identification card issued by this state that has not 16 17 been certified by the United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) as being compliant with the 18 requirements of the REAL ID Act of 2005. A REAL ID 19 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card 20 will be clearly marked on the face indicating that it 21 is not compliant with the federal REAL ID Act of 2005 22 and is not acceptable for official federal purposes. 23 The driver license or identification card will have a 24

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1 unique design or color indicator that clearly distinguishes it from a compliant license or card. 2 Original Driver License and Identification Card Issuance: 3 2. Application for an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL 4 a. 5 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card shall be made to Service Oklahoma. 6 b. Service Oklahoma employees shall perform all document 7 recognition and other requirements needed for approval 8 9 of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card 10 application. 11 Upon approval of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL 12 с. 13 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card application, the applicant may take the approved 14 application document to a licensed operator to receive 15 a temporary driver license or identification card. 16 d. The licensed operator shall process the approved REAL 17 ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or 18 Identification Card application and upon payment shall 19 provide the applicant a temporary driver license or 20 identification card. A temporary driver license or 21 identification card shall afford the holder the 22 privileges otherwise granted by the specific class of 23 driver license or identification card for the period 24

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of time listed on the temporary driver license or identification card or the period of time prior to the applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card, whichever time period is shorter.

6 3. REAL ID Compliant Driver License and Identification Card7 Renewal and Replacement:

Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID 8 a. 9 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card may be 10 made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator; provided, such licensed operator is authorized to 11 12 process application for REAL ID Compliant Driver 13 Licenses and Identification Cards. A licensed operator may process the voluntary downgrade of a REAL 14 ID Compliant Commercial Driver License to any lower 15 class license upon request of the licensee; provided, 16 no additional endorsements or restrictions are placed 17 on the license. 18

b. Service Oklahoma employees or authorized licensed
operators shall perform all document recognition and
other requirements needed for approval of a renewal or
replacement REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
Identification Card application.

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- c. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID
 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card
 application, the applicant may receive a temporary
 driver license or identification card from Service
 Oklahoma or an authorized licensed operator.
- d. A temporary driver license or identification card 6 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall 7 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by 8 9 the specific class of driver license or identification card being renewed or replaced for the period of time 10 listed on the temporary driver license or 11 identification card or the period of time prior to the 12 13 applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant Driver License or Identification Card, whichever time period is 14 shorter. 15
- e. For purposes of this title, an application for a REAL
 ID Compliant Driver License or Identification Card by
 an individual with a valid Oklahoma-issued driver
 license or identification card shall be considered a
 renewal of a REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
 Identification Card.

4. REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License and Identification CardRenewal and Replacement:

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1 Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID a. Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card may 2 be made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator. 3 A licensed operator may process the voluntary 4 5 downgrade of a REAL ID Noncompliant Commercial Driver License to any lower class license upon request of the 6 licensee; provided, no additional endorsements or 7 restrictions are added to the license. 8

- 9 b. Service Oklahoma employees or licensed operators shall
 10 perform all document recognition and other

Except as otherwise provided in this section, every driver license shall be issued for a period of either four (4) years or eight (8) years; provided, if the applicant or licensee is an alien provides an individual tax identification number pursuant to Section 6-106 of this title, the license shall be issued for a period which does not exceed the lesser of:

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1. Four (4) years or eight (8) years; or

2 2. The expiration date on the valid documentation authorizing 3 the presence of the applicant or licensee in the United States, as 4 required by paragraph 9 of subsection A of Section 6-103 of this 5 title two (2) years.

B. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the expiration
date of an initial license shall be no more than either four (4)
years or eight (8) years from the last day of the month of issuance
or no more than either four (4) years or eight (8) years from the
last day of the birth month of the applicant immediately preceding
the date of issuance, if requested by the applicant.

12 C. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the expiration13 date of a renewal license shall be:

For a renewal during the month of expiration, either four
 (4) years or eight (8) years from the last day of the month of
 expiration of the expiring license or either four (4) or eight (8)
 years from the last day of the birth month of the licensee
 immediately preceding the expiration date of the expiring license,
 if requested by the licensee; or

For a renewal prior to the month of expiration, as provided
 by rule of Service Oklahoma, either four (4) or eight (8) years from
 the last day of the month of expiration of the current license;
 provided, no license shall be issued with an expiration date of more
 than five (5) years from the date of renewal on a four (4) year

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1 license or nine (9) years from the date of renewal on an eight (8)
2 year license.

D. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection E of Section
1550.42 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, any Oklahoma driver
license that is not more than one (1) year past the date of
expiration provided on the driver license shall be presumed to be a
valid form of identification for the purposes of renewing an
Oklahoma driver license.

9 E. Except as otherwise provided in this section, every driver license shall be renewable by the licensee upon application to 10 either Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator, furnishing the 11 12 current mailing address of the person and payment of the required fee, if the person is otherwise eligible for renewal. If the 13 licensee is an alien applicant that was previously issued a driver 14 license after confirmation by the Tax Commission to Service Oklahoma 15 that the applicant filed a 2024 state tax return pursuant to 16 17 subsection A of Section 6-103 of this title and an individual tax identification number pursuant to subsection B of Section 6-106 of 18 this title, then the licensee shall appear before a driver license 19 examiner of Service Oklahoma and shall be issued a renewal driver 20 license for a period which does not exceed the lesser of: 21 1. Four (4) years or eight (8) years; or 22

23 2. The expiration date on the valid documentation authorizing
24 the presence of the applicant or licensee in the United States, as

required by paragraph 9 of subsection A of Section 6-103 of this
title or a licensed operator, whereupon the Tax Commission shall

F. All applicants for renewals of driver licenses who have
proven collision records or apparent physical defects may be
required to take an examination as specified by Service Oklahoma.

9 G. When a person makes application for a driver license, or makes application to renew a driver license, and the person has been 10 convicted of, or received a deferred judgment for, any offense 11 12 required to register pursuant to the Sex Offenders Registration Act, 13 the driver license shall be valid for a period of one (1) year from the month of issuance, but may be renewed yearly during the time the 14 person is registered on the Sex Offender Registry. Notwithstanding 15 any other provision of law, the cost for such license shall be the 16 same as for other driver licenses and renewals. 17

H. Service Oklahoma shall promulgate rules prescribing forms of identification acceptable for the renewal of an Oklahoma driver license.

18 living outside of Oklahoma and having a valid Class D driver license 19 issued by the State of Oklahoma this state, requiring no material 20 change, may apply for no more than three consecutive renewals or 21 replacement of such license by mail or online, in accordance with 22 Service Oklahoma rules. A fourth consecutive renewal or replacement 23 must be done in person.

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SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-125 of Title 47, unless there
 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Service Oklahoma shall make space available on the
credential line of the front of a driver license issued to an
applicant who provided an individual tax identification number to
prominently print "ITIN Non-citizen", which shall be designed by
Service Oklahoma and shall serve as a notation of status as a noncitizen of the United States.

B. Service Oklahoma shall include the words "License holder is not a U.S. citizen and is ineligible to vote in any election" on all driver licenses affixed with "ITIN Non-citizen" as required by subsection A of this section.

14 C. An applicant or licensee who provides an individual tax 15 identification number to Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator 16 shall be prohibited from receiving voter registration services as 17 described in subsection A of Section 4-109.3 of Title 26 of the 18 Oklahoma Statutes.

D. For any driver license issued pursuant to Section 6-106 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the driver license found in Field 4 shall begin with the letters "ITIN"."

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
