11	An Act relating to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority; requiring that portions of certain
12	appropriated funds be used for certain purposes; directing Oklahoma Health Care Authority to implement
13	increased payment for certain long-term care and intermediate care facilities for individuals with
14	intellectual disabilities; providing for duties and compensation of administrators and employees;
15	authorizing payment of certain expenses; authorizing certain transfers; requiring certain transfers;
16	authorizing the exemption of unanticipated federal
17	funds from expenditure and budgetary limitations; providing procedures; requiring certain budget
18	procedures; prohibiting certain budget procedures; providing an effective date; and declaring an
19	emergency.
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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
22	SECTION 1. From the funds appropriated to the Oklahoma Health
23	Care Authority in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1125 of the 2nd Session
24	of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Thirty Million Dollars

1 (\$30,000,000.00) shall be used to increase reimbursements to long-2 term care facilities and intermediate care facilities for 3 individuals with intellectual disabilities.

SECTION 2. A. The duties and compensation of employees, not
otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
upon the Oklahoma Health Care Authority by law shall be set by the
Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority.

B. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is authorized to:

9 1. Pay professional expenses of the Administrator of the
10 Authority including dues, licenses, professional memberships, and
11 continuing education classes conducted in this state; and

12 2. Pay professional expenses of any employee including dues, 13 licenses, professional memberships, continuing medical education 14 classes conducted in this state, and medical malpractice insurance 15 provided he or she is a full-time employee of the Authority in 16 accordance with subsection B of Section 5006 of Title 63 of the 17 Oklahoma Statutes and is utilizing those professional skills in the 18 performance of his or her job duties.

19 SECTION 3. In order to facilitate cash management of federal 20 grant receipts and disbursements, the Office of Management and 21 Enterprise Services shall transfer monies between the Oklahoma 22 Health Care Authority federal and revolving funds in amounts 23 requested by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority.

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SECTION 4. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is authorized to
 transfer funds from Fund 205 and Fund 270 to Fund 200 and Fund 340
 to satisfy claims made to the Authority under the Supplemental
 Hospital Offset Payment Program Act.

5 SECTION 5. The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care 6 Authority may request that receipt and expenditure of unanticipated 7 federal funds awarded after July 1, 2024, be exempt from expenditure 8 limitations and from budgetary limitations.

9 SECTION 6. A. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall transfer monies appropriated from the 10 General Revenue Fund and the Health Care Enhancement Fund to the 11 12 Oklahoma Health Care Authority disbursing funds in the amounts and 13 ratios requested by the Authority, except that the cumulative amounts transferred shall not exceed the cumulative amounts of equal 14 monthly allotments of the appropriations from the General Revenue 15 Fund and Health Care Enhancement Fund. 16

B. Monies appropriated or collected for the fiscal year ending 17 June 30, 2025, may be transferred to these disbursing funds for the 18 fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, to satisfy encumbrances and 19 obligations of such fiscal year; provided, that monies equal in 20 amount are transferred from appropriations or collections for the 21 fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, to the disbursing fund for the 22 fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, to satisfy encumbrances and 23 obligations of such fiscal year. All transfer requests shall be in 24

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writing to the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
 Services.

3 C. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall maintain records of4 the inter-year transfers.

5 SECTION 7. The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care 6 Authority may request, through the Director of the Office of 7 Management and Enterprise Services, the early transfer by the 8 Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the General Revenue 9 Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the agency's disbursing 10 funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

SECTION 8. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
SECTION 9. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
