Research Analysis

HB 1005 amends the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act to include a definition for “harm-reduction services,” as services to reduce the spread of drug complications and drug-related disease and promote the safe recovery and disposal of related waste. The measure additionally applies exceptions to items in possession of harm reduction service providers when determining whether an object is “drug paraphernalia.” HB 1005 also creates a new law that specifies who can offer harm-reduction services and outlines the procedure for provider registration and reporting.

HB 1005, as introduced, provides permissive language for certain entities to offer harm-reduction services and directs the Department of Health to promulgate rules. The measure has no fiscal or revenue considerations for the state.
