**Research Analysis**

The subcommittee recommendation for HB 2163 gives licensure reimbursement eligibility to clinical psychology interns and postdoctoral fellows. The fellows and interns must be actively receiving board-approved supervision from a licensed psychologist who reviews and records the fellow or intern's work on a weekly basis.
