**Research Analysis**

The floor amendment for HB 2367 adds a sunset provision effective July 1, 2026.

HB 2367 creates exceptions to the Open Meeting Act for members of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission so that they may discuss certain matters outside of a public meeting, so long as there is no discussion regarding pending legislative proceedings of the commission and appropriation of OCC funds. Within five days of the event where a quorum is present outside of a public meeting, the commissioners must report on its website the subject matter received or discussed, unless the OCC wishes to take potential action on the subject. In that case, the potential action item shall be documented a least 48 hours before the OCC considers the item. Lastly, the measure requires periodic training on the Open Meeting Act for commissioners and designated staff.
