**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 2740, requires that reports on property and intoxicating liquors that are seized from raids on violators of the prohibitory liquor or gambling laws of the state be delivered to the Alcoholic Beverage Law Enforcement (ABLE) Commission. The report was previously delivered to the sheriff of the county. The measure also directs ABLE to store the seized alcoholic beverages.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB2740, in its current form, requires the Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement (ABLE) commission to store seized alcoholic beverages. The ABLE commission estimates that this measure will cost the agency \$60,000.00 to purchase a box truck to transport seized alcoholic beverages, and \$20,000.00 to obtain secured storage in various locations around the state. Therefore, there is a possible fiscal impact of \$80,000.00 to the state budget.
