## **Research Analysis**

HB 3501 requires the Department of Public Safety to recognize and act upon a report of conviction in a court of any federally recognized Indian tribe within Oklahoma or a court of the United States in the same manner it acts upon any report of conviction from an Oklahoma state or municipal court.

The Senate Amendment adds a definition of "qualified court" to mean those tribal court systems that have adopted the Tribal Law and Order Act of 2010.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The measure, as amended by the Senate, would allow the Department of Public Safety, for the purpose of driver license suspension and revocation, to receive convictions from tribal courts in the same manner as Oklahoma courts and municipal courts.

The Senate amendments add a definition for qualified court.

Upon review and with consultation from the Department of Public Safety, no direct fiscal impact to the state is anticipated from passage of the measure. No need for additional appropriations to implement the provisions of the measure is expected.
