**Research Analysis**

HB 3752 provides that it is unlawful for the owner of real property which has been used to grow and harvest marijuana crops to willfully desert or abandon the real property without restoring the land to its previous condition. Violation is a misdemeanor punishable by up to 1 year in the county jail, a fine of \$1,000 or both fine and imprisonment. The measure also allows a commissioned peace officer to seize any real property that has been abandoned or deserted in such a manner.
