**Research Analysis**

SB 1070 modifies who may attest to the issuance of a physical disability placard by allowing an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse to attest that the applicant is physically disabled. The measure also allows a person who is up to six months postpartum to apply for a physically disabled placard. The measure requires Service Oklahoma to issue a yellow temporary placard to any person who has given birth within the past six months provided the person requesting the temporary placard submits a birth certificate or record of birth for the child and a valid Oklahoma driver license, a valid Oklahoma identification card, or other proof of principal residency in the state. Service Oklahoma may charge a minimal fee for the temporary placard.

**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 1070 requires Service Oklahoma to issue temporary placard to women who have recently given birth, provided certain documentation be submitted. Service Oklahoma has determined that this measure would have an overall net zero impact to the state, as the bill requires Service Oklahoma to charge a minimal fee for these placards, so the fee assessed should offset the costs of issuance.
