**Bill Analysis**

SB 1672 creates the Oklahoma Judicial Retirement Act of 2024. The measure requires each judge or justice of the Oklahoma Supreme Court, Court of Criminal Appeals, Court of Civil Appeals, or district court to retire at the age of 75. Judges and justices may serve the remainder of their term upon reaching 75 years of age. Any judge or justice who reaches 75 before the effective date shall either retire on the effective date of this measure or after their term expires. Any judge or justice completing his or her term instead of retiring at the age of 75 shall sign and deliver an affidavit to the chief or presiding judge of his or her court that declares the intent to complete the term. The measure provides for severability of its provisions.
