**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for SB 715 makes some minor changes to bill language including replacing “the” before “entrance to a polling place” with “an” and adding “or in-person absentee voting site” to the definition of election enclosure.

SB 715 changes rules related to electioneering to state that no person shall be allowed to electioneer within 300 feet of an entrance to a polling place, in-person absentee voting site or a person who is standing in line to vote outside the polling place or voting site. No person except for election officials, people voting at that polling place, and an accompanying dependent shall be allowed inside the election enclosure or within 50 feet of an entrance to a polling place or in-person absentee voting site. The measure also provides definitions of electioneering and election enclosure.
